1	National Curriculum Framework	As a follow-up of the NEP 2020, the development of four National Curriculum Frameworks, viz., NCF for School Education, NCF for Early Childhood Care and Education, NCF for Teacher Education and NCF for Adult Education has been initiated. The National Steering Committee under the Chairpersonship of Dr. K. Kasturirangan was set up by the Ministry of Education to undertake and guide the development of NCFs. the National Curriculum Framework for Foundational Stage had been brought out and launched by the Ministry of Education on 20 <sup>th</sup> October 2022. In continuation of this NCF-FS, National Curriculum Framework for School Education – Pre-Draft is also ready ( <a href="https://ncf.ncert.gov.in/webadmin/assets/b27f04eb-65af-467f-af12-105275251546">https://ncf.ncert.gov.in/webadmin/assets/b27f04eb-65af-467f-af12-105275251546</a> ).  NCERT has solicited feedback on the pre-draft NCF-SE from diverse stakeholders like students, parents, teachers, teacher educators, experts, scholars and professionals. Feedback from diverse stakeholders will further help NSC to look critically into different modalities and approaches that this framework is proposing.
2	Pre-cursor to 3 <sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Education Working Group	the 3 <sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Education Working Group was held in Bhubaneswar from April 27-28, 2023 and the precursor events to the G20 Education Working Group Meetings was held from April 23-26, 2023. A special exhibition on the theme of "Future of Work" was organized and was open to the public between April 23-25 and then on April 27 & 28.  As a part of ''Jan-Bhagidari', month long events commenced in the state of Odisha from April 1, 2023 (which is also celebrated as "Utkal Dibasa" or "Odisha Day"). More than 100,000 people have participated in these Jan

3	Bilateral meeting with Singapore	A Singaporean delegation led by Singaporean High Commissioner (SHC) H.E Mr. Simon Wong called on Hon'ble Minister of Education, Skill development and Entrepreneurship on 25 <sup>th</sup> April 2023. During the meeting Hon. SM suggested both sides should work together to identify concrete deliverables and chart out a roadmap for bilateral cooperation in skill development between India and Singapore. In the field of school education both countries can work together to ensure that courses on future skills are integrated within the school curriculum. Skills Future Singapore under the Singaporean Ministry of Education can work with NCERT and CBSE in this regard. Hon. SM also suggested that Singapore must consider involving its industry partners to scale up the level of engagement with

The third Education Working Group meeting under G20 commenced on 26th April 2023 in Bhubaneswar, Odisha with a seminar on 'Building Capacities for Lifelong Learning in the context of Future of Work'. The meeting was a continuation of the previous two working group meetings held in Chennai and Amritsar earlier, aimed at discussing and implementing innovative ideas and policies to globally transform the education sector. Over 60 delegates from G20 member countries, invitee countries and International Organisation countries participated in the 3 day meeting. Hon. Minister of State for Education, was the Guest of Honour. Apart from the discussions, the three-day meeting also included a cultural programme, featuring traditional Odishi performances. On the last day of the seminar, the delegates visited the Konark temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Union Education and Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Minister addressed the workshop. High Commissioner of the Republic of Singapore to India; Deputy Secretary, Higher Education and Skills, Ministry of Education Singapore participated in the plenary session. Secretary, Higher Education, Secretary, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship Secretary, Secretary School Education and Literacy and senior officials of the Ministry of Education and Skill Development & Entrepreneurship attended the workshop from the Indian side.  The objective of this workshop was threefold. (a) exchange of knowledge between India and Singapore, in the sphere of education and skilling; (b) develop pathways for collaboration on best practices and policy responses that enable the development of robust education and skilling ecosystems; and c) exchange of views among senior policymakers on the way forward.
