In addition, the website is user friendly and responsive which can be seen on any device including mobile phones. The applicant(s) can file online complaint, RTI application and will be immediately sent SMS acknowledgment on his / her mobile number as well as through his / her

e-mail address. The website is rich in content, which contains rules, regulations, norms and standards, frequently asked questions, information for ongoing activities, teacher education curriculum, publications, video galleries etc. The Minister congratulated NCTE for this transparency and progressive step.
