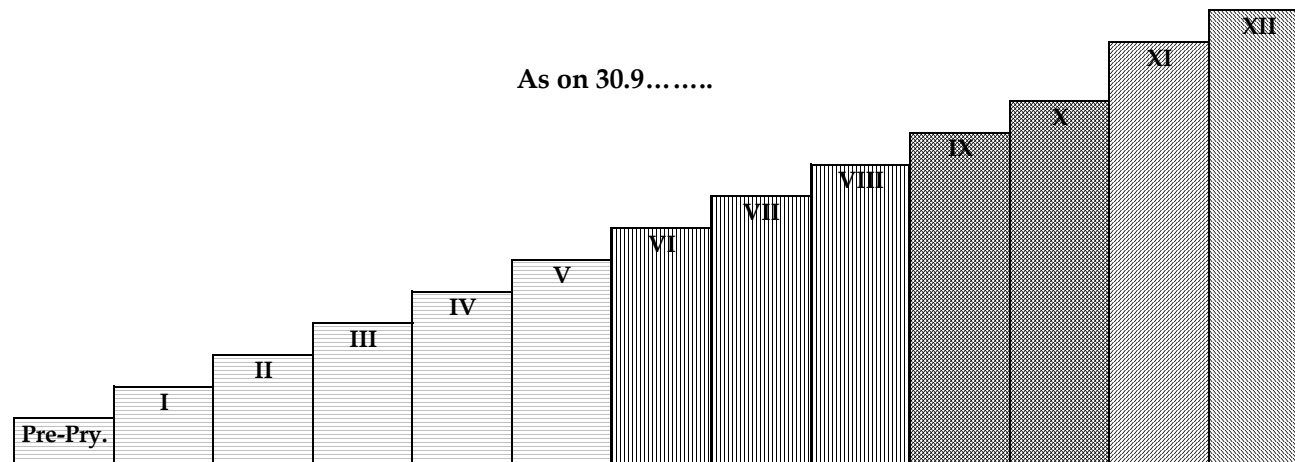

| 3 | <b>Institutions</b>   | "Institutions" means institutions <b>recognized/approved by a competent authority</b> ( e.g., Central/State Government or their authorised subordinate agencies, Boards of Secondary Education, UGC, AICTE, MCI, ICAR or other duly empowered authority  |

Extracts of above provisions are reproduced below:-</p> <p><b>THE PANCHAYATS: Article 243 (d):</b> "Panchayat" means <b>an institution</b> (by whatever name called) <b>of self- government constituted</b> under article 243B, <b>for the rural areas;</b></p> <p><b>Article 243B: Constitution of Panchayats.</b> – (1) There shall be constituted in every State, Panchayats at the village, intermediate and district levels in accordance with the provisions of this Part.</p> <p>(2) Notwithstanding anything in clause (1), Panchayats at the intermediate level may not be constituted in a State having a population not exceeding twenty lakhs.</p> <p><b>THE MUNICIPALITIES: Article 243(P)(e) :</b> "Municipality" means <b>an institution of self-government</b> constituted under article 243Q;</p> <p><b>Article 243Q. Constitution of Municipalities.</b> – (1) There shall be constituted in every State, –</p> <p>(a) a Nagar Panchayat (by whatever name called) for a transitional area, that is to say, an area in transition from a rural area to an urban area;</p> <p>(b) a Municipal Council for a smaller urban area; and</p> <p>(c) a Municipal Corporation for a larger urban area,</p> <p>in accordance with the provision of this Act</p> |
| 6 | <b>Private Aided:</b> | <b>Private Aided:</b> Institutions/schools managed by an individual, trust, society, or other private organisation and <b>receiving regular maintenance grants</b> from Central/State Governments or local body.   |

- 7 **Private Unaided:** **Private Unaided:** Institutions/schools managed by an individual, trust, society or other private organisation and **not receiving regular maintenance grants** from Government (Central/State), or local body . An institution which is in receipt of an ad-hoc grant for a specific purpose like building grant, grant for strengthening of library or laboratory facilities, one time subsidy towards teacher salary etc. but not receiving regular maintenance grant should be treated as an unaided institution.
- 8 **School Category according to stage** A school will be categorised according to the **highest stage** (as per State pattern) at which it imparts instructions. Thus
- A school having highest class up to XI or XII will be termed as **Higher (Senior) Secondary School/Intermediate College**.
- A school having highest class up to IX or X will be termed as **Secondary School**.
- A school having highest class up to VII or VIII will be termed as **Upper Primary (Middle) School**.
- A school having highest class up to IV or V will be termed as **Primary School**.
- Pre-Primary Schools/ Classes** means schools/classes imparting instruction at a level **preceding Class I of the Primary stage** I.e. Nursery/LKG/UKG/ Kindergarten Classes , but exclude Anganwadies, run under ICDS, and Balwadies run under any other schemes of States Government/Local Bodies or private crutches etc.
- Residential Schools** means school in which all or nearly all (**say more than 90%**) **students stay in hostels** attached to the school and includes Ashram Schools.
- Anganwadi** means an Anganwadi run under Centrally sponsored **ICDS Scheme**.
- Balwadi** means a Balwadi run by State Government/local bodies and **exclude ICDS Anganwadi**
- 9 **Institutions for Girls** Means an institution which enrolls **only female** students.
- 10 **Enrolment by type of Institution** Means the total number of students studying in an educational institution as a whole irrespective of other different levels of courses being taught in that institution.
- 11 **Enrolment by stage/level course** Means enrolment in different levels/stage of various courses irrespective of the type of institutions in which these courses are being run.
- 12 **Rural and Urban Areas** Rural area is that which comes under **jurisdiction of Panchayat** (as defined in Point 5 above).
- Urban area is that which comes under the **jurisdiction of Municipality** (as defined in Point 5 above) a Cantonment Board, notified Town Area Committee or any other such as Urban Local Body.

13 **Students with Special Needs** Students with Special Needs means a student **suffering from a disability** as defined in the Persons With Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995. "Disability" means-a person suffering from not less than forty per cent. of any disability as certified by a medical authority;

Following categories have been defined under Disability:

**A. Visually Impaired: This includes:**

**1. Blindness :** "Blindness" refers to a condition where a person suffers from any of the following conditions, namely:-

- (i) Total absence of **sight**. or
- (ii) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses; or
- (iii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse;

**2. Low vision:** "Person with low vision" means a person with impairment of visual functioning even after treatment or standard refractive correction but who uses or is potentially capable of using vision for the planning or execution of a task with appropriate assistive device;

**B. Hearing Impaired: This includes:**

**3. Hearing impairment;**"Hearing impairment" means loss of **sixty decibels or more** in the better ear in the conversational range of frequencies;

**C. Orthopaedically impaired: This includes:**

**4. Loco motor disability (Orthopaedically impaired):**"Loco motor disability" means **disability of the bones, joints muscles** leading to substantial restriction of the movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy,

**D. Mentally Challenged: This includes:**

**5. Mental retardation;**"Mental retardation" means a condition of arrested or incomplete **development of mind** of a person which is specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence;

**6. Mental illness;**"Mental illness" means any **mental disorder** other than mental retardation;

**E. Others: includes:**

**(a) . "Leprosy cured person" , i.e.,** any person who has been **cured** of leprosy but is suffering from-

- (i) **Loss of sensation** in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis; but having sufficient **mobility** in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;

(iii) Extreme **physical deformity** as well as advanced age which prevents him from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

**(b)** Students suffering from **two or more** of the above disabilities.
