1	Pariksha Pe Charcha 2024	<p>The 7<sup>th</sup> edition of Pariksha Pe Charcha programme (PPC 2024) was held in a town-hall type interactive format on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2024 at Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. Hon'ble Prime Minister interacted with students, teachers and parents from all over the country and abroad.</p> <p>Hon. Prime Minister also took a walkthrough of the art and crafts exhibition showcased on the occasion. Conceptualized by Hon. Prime Minister himself, PPC is a movement bringing together students, parents, teachers and society to foster an environment where each child's unique individuality is celebrated, encouraged and allowed to express itself fully.</p> <p>The highlight of this year's PPC 2024 was the overwhelming participation of students, teachers and parents from 38.88 lakh in 2023 to 2.26 crore. The event was telecast live on various channels and viewed by more than 18.00 crore viewers from India and abroad.</p>
2	PM SHRI	<p>Hon. Union Minister for Education and Skill Development &amp; Entrepreneurship, along with Hon. Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh and other dignitaries launched 928 PM SHRI Schools in Uttar Pradesh, in Lucknow on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2024. Participants from 928 locations also joined the event virtually. The dignitaries visited an exhibition set up by the school children.</p>

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3	Kala Utsav 2023-24	<p>The National Level Kala Utsav 2023-24 was organized at New Delhi during 9-12 January, 2024. This year's event witnessed performances in 10 art forms: Vocal Music - Classical; Vocal Music - Traditional Folk; Instrumental Music - Percussive; Instrumental Music - Melodic; Dance - Classical; Dance - Folk; Visual Arts (2-dimensional); Visual Arts (3-dimensional); Indigenous Toys and Games; and Drama (Solo acting).</p> <p>A total of 680 children (336 girls and 334 boys) from 34 States and Union Territories, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti showcased their art forms in the above categories. Union Minister for Education and Skill Development &amp; Entrepreneurship attended the inaugural ceremony of the Kala Utsav 2023 as the Chief Guest on 9th January 2024. Minister of State for Education, was also present at the function as the Guest of Honour.</p> <p>Hon. Union Minister of State for Education and Hon. Minister of State for External Affairs and Education attended the valedictory ceremony of the Kala Utsav 2023 on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2024.</p>
4	National School Band Competition 2023-24	<p>The Department of School Education &amp; Literacy in collaboration with the Ministry of Defence conducted the National School Band Competition 2023-24 as part of Republic Day Celebrations, 2024. The Grand finale of the event was organized on January 21 &amp; 22, 2024 at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium, New Delhi. Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, attended the Grand Finalé of the National School Band Competition 2023-24 on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2024.</p> <p>A total of 457 students of 16 schools from 15 States/Union Territories and Union Participated in the Grand Finale.</p> <p>The competition was held in four categories: Boys Brass Band, Girls Brass Band, Boys Pipe Band and Girls Pipe Band. Droupadi Girls High School, Odisha, received the first prize in Pipe Band Girls; St. Teresa's Higher Secondary School, Kannur, Kerala, received the first prize in Brass Band Girls; Govt. Sr. Secondary School, West Point, Gangtok, Sikkim, received the first prize in Brass Band Boys; and PM SHRI School Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Rajasthan, received the first prize in Pipe Band Boys.</p> <p>In addition to the participating teams, there was a special band performance by the school band team from Government Sardar Patel Senior Secondary School, Kalpeni, Lakshadweep.</p>
5	Prerana School	<p>Department of School Education &amp; Literacy has launched 'Prerana: An Experiential Learning program on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2024. Prerana is a week-long residential program for selected students of classes IX to XII.</p>



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		<p>Prerana program will run from a School, established in 1888, in one of the oldest living cities of India, Vadnagar, district Mehsana, Gujarat. Hon'ble Prime Minister is an alumnus of this school.</p> <p>The curriculum of Prerana School, prepared by IIT Gandhi Nagar, is rooted in nine value based themes: Swabhiman and Vinay, Shaurya and Sahas, Parishram and Samarpan, Karuna and Sewa, Vividhta and Ekta, Satyanishtha and Shuchita, Navachar and Jigyasa, Shraddha aur Vishwas, and Swatantrata and Kartavya. The day-wise program schedule will feature yoga, mindfulness, and meditation sessions, followed by experiential learning, thematic sessions, and hands-on interesting learning activities. Evening activities will include visits to ancient and heritage sites, inspirational film screenings, mission life creative activities, talent shows etc. ensuring a holistic learning approach. Apart from this, students will engage in diverse activities, embracing indigenous knowledge systems, the latest State-of-Art technologies, and learnings from inspirational personalities.</p> <p>Every Prerana Batch has 20 students (10 boys &amp; 10 girls) from 10 districts of different States/UTs. The registration portal of PRERANA was launched on 03.01.2024 and so far, total number of registration is 3,74,479 in the pilot phase from 6 States/UTs- Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Haryana, and Daman and Diu &amp; Dadra Nagar Haveli. The first batch started on 15.01.2024 and 100 students from 50 districts will be attending the program in the pilot phase.</p> <p>These participants will be mentored by teachers who were trained at IIT Gandhinagar by experts from IIT-G, IIM-A, IKS etc. The program is being implemented by Department of School Education and Literacy, MoE, through Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti.</p>
6	Multilingualism	<p>National Education Policy recommends promoting multilingualism in education at every level, so that students get the opportunity to study in their language, and can have better learning outcomes. Studying in one's language can provide a student with the natural space to think innovatively without any language barrier.</p> <p>The Government of India has decided that study materials for all courses under school and higher education will be made available digitally in Indian languages included in the 8<sup>th</sup> Schedule of the Constitution.</p> <p>On 19<sup>th</sup> January 2024, the Ministry of Education directed all school and higher education regulators to make study material in Indian languages available for all courses in the next three years. Department of School Education will also take up the issue with all States/UTs.</p>
7	Veer Gatha 3.0	<p>Hon. Raksha Mantri along with Hon. Union Minister for Education and Skill Development &amp; Entrepreneurship felicitated 'Super-100' winners of Project Veer Gatha 3.0, in New Delhi on January 25,</p>

		<p>2024.</p> <p>Veer Gatha 3.0 was held between July 13 to September 30, 2023, wherein a record 1.36 crore students from 2.42 lakh schools pan-India shared their inspirational stories in terms of essays, poems, drawings and multimedia presentations. After a series of evaluations under various rubrics for assessment at the State and District level, nearly 3,900 entries were submitted for national level evaluation. The national level evaluation committee appointed by the Ministry of Education selected the top 100 entries. Twenty-five (25) winners from each category - Class 3rd to 5th, Class 6th to 8th, Class 9th to 10th, and Class 11th to 12th were selected.</p>
