

MINUTES OF THE 36TH PROJECT APPROVAL BOARD MEETING (16TH COMPOSITE MEETING) HELD ON 27TH FEB 2014, FOR APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL WORK PLAN & BUDGET 2014-15 FOR RASHTRIYA MADHYAMIK SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RMSA) AND ITS CONSTITUENT SCHEMES INCLUDING ICT, GIRL'S HOSTEL, VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND IEDSS FOR THE STATE OF **CHHATTISGARH**.

1. The Meeting of the Project Approval Board for considering the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2014-15 for the State of Chhattisgarh under Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), ICT, Girls' Hostels, Vocational Education and IEDSS was held on 27th February, 2014, under the Chairpersonship of Shri R. Bhattacharya, Secretary (SE&L). List of participants who attended the meeting is attached at **Annexure-I**. The Fact Sheet for the State of Chhattisgarh with Educational Indicators is attached at **Annexure-II**.

2. At the outset Secretary (SE&L) welcomed all the participants. Thereafter Joint Secretary, Ms. Radha Chauhan, briefed PAB that at the beginning of the 12th Five Year Plan (2012-13), had committed liabilities to the tune of Rs. 8500 crores, but since no new works were approved in 2012-13 and with limited approvals in the year 2013-14, the Committed liabilities have come down to the tune of Rs. 4800 crores. However, the concern still remains since a number of States still have a huge backlog of Non-Recurring works which could not be started due to the fixed cost norms of the earlier approvals, and where the States have not been able to arrange for

the gap-funding between the earlier approved norms and the SoRs, and where the funds have been released to the States resulting in the situation where the States are sitting on a huge unspent balance. She informed the PAB that this has resulted in preventing the release of funds from the Ministry on one hand, which later on may lead to surrendering of funds from the scheme, while the Scheme itself suffers from lack of funds. In light of the situation the State is requested to utilise the funds sanctioned in order for further releases as well for new approvals being considered by the PAB.

3. She also noted that there is a need for the State to shift the activities of the subsumed component schemes to the RMSA SPD. She informed that for the funds for all the above components being released to the RMSA Implementing Society (**Through the State**), all correspondence and communication will be with RMSA SPD and the Secretary Education of the State/UT including financial matters concerning all its subsumed components. Therefore, the States would do well to streamline the activities relating to ICT @ Schools, IEDSS, Vocational Education and Girls' Hostel functioning into the RMSA Society and formally notify the RMSA SPD as the nodal person anchoring all these activities.
4. She also informed the Board that in order to facilitate efficient implementation and also address issue relating to amount available to States under MMER, following provisions have been made:
 - i. Release of ad-hoc recurring grant to the tune of 25% of the expenditure incurred in the previous FY by the States/UTs.
 - ii. Facility of spill-over of funds relating to approvals of non-recurring grant that would provide States/UTs with the flexibility to deploy funds regardless of year of its approval (but as per norms under which they were approved).

iii. MMER to be available as against the Annual Plan approval.

5. Thereafter following general issues were highlighted for consideration and guidance of the PAB:

- (i) **Quality of Inclusion in Secondary schools (CWSN under IEDSS):** The issue of deployment of special education teachers was highlighted. It was pointed that at present there is no deployment policy of special education teachers in any State/UT and their (special education teachers) role in secondary classes needs to be clearly outlined. At present, in most States/UTs, most of these teachers have not been deployed in the schools but rather at the block headquarters with no defined role and responsibility. PAB advised that States should ensure that all these special education teachers (for whom the financial support is being made from IEDSS) should be deployed in the school(s), and if they are serving more than one school in the vicinity then their formal deployment should be with the school having larger number of CWSN children.

PAB also requested NCERT to guide the States by detailing the role of special education teachers at the secondary level and if need be modify the curriculum to meet the needs of CWSN children. Even though the IEDSS scheme has been subsumed under the RMSA, the planning and implementation of this component is still being carried out in an isolated manner at the implementation level, with some of the States/UTs still implementing the interventions under this component totally through NGOs which is adverse to the overall objectives of scheme which envisages State as the prime implementing agency and NGOs role being limited in aiding and supporting the State.

The PAB emphasized that Secondary Schools need to be made more inclusive for CWSN, with adaptations to infrastructure to be planned

under the RMSA non-recurring / civil works component, while the teacher training for improving inclusive practices (targeted at CWSN) of subject teachers should be within the RMSA teacher training package.

- (ii) **UDISE Data:** The issue with regard to the quality of UDISE data of the State/UTs was also raised. In the current year, MHRD/ TSG has used UDISE data to verify the distance from the UPS to the proposed secondary school and on the basis of distance shown in the UDISE data, the current year proposals for establishing new schools have been appraised. However, the State/UTs claim some technical problem in Column no 19B of the UDISE DCF which results in inconsistency as the distance from UPS to Secondary Schools is shown as zero in many cases even if the actual distance is 6km or 15 kms. Due to this discrepancy in the data, proposals for new school were not be found eligible for up gradation.

NUEPA was requested to look into this and the State/UTs may pursue the matter of correcting the UDISE data with NUEPA. Further, though the timeline for sending the UDISE data (Elementary and Secondary) to NUEPA is December every year, it is seen that that States/UTs have not been able to send their UDISE data to NUEPA in time, which in turn causes delay in the appraisal of RMSA plans, since they are based on the UDISE data. Discrepancies are also noted in the UDISE data, which are reflected in the mismatch between this years' data (2013-14) and last year's data (2012-13).

The coding /categorization (lowest class/ highest class) is being followed differently in different States/UTs, resulting in various interpretations of the number of schools, for a same set of schools. Thus, while in Kerala, a school is given a single UDISE code for the Primary, Upper Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary, in Andhra

Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Odisha, etc, the UDISE code for Primary school is different from the code of the Secondary school and from that of the Higher Secondary school, etc, resulting in these States showing a higher number of government schools.

PAB requested NUEPA to clarify this and this is especially critical since the UDISE will be the official data from this year onwards.

- (iii) **Quality Interventions- Adoption of Project Based Approach:** The PAB outlining the overall shift that is needed with four years of activity based interventions under the Quality head of RMSA, emphasized the need for the States to adopt a holistic project based approach to interventions wherein selected activities are put together in a manner that the outcomes and objectives that are envisaged through those interventions that are clearly defined and are measurable over a period of time through basic indicators such as enhancement in enrolment, retention, transition, performance or reduction in drop out and so on. Each such intervention needs to be substantiated by its performance outcome which should be taken up for evaluation by the State/UTs as part of its MMER activities.
- (iv) In view of the limited availability of funds under the programme and also the fact that States/UTs have been unable to act on previous approvals relating to recruitment and appointment of staff , PAB indicated that approvals regarding Lab Attendants, Librarians and Multi task Support Staff previously committed but not yet acted upon be revoked with immediate effect. Approval/Commitment for salary was for that particular year and if not acted upon and not revalidated specifically, later on stands withdrawn.
- (v) PAB also took note of huge backlog in recruitment and appointment of approved teachers. In view of the limited fund availability under the

scheme, it was noted that provision of salary under the annual recurring grant shall be earmarked and committed only for personnel formally in place. Any subsequent appointment commitment of RMSA funds will be subject to availability of funds in the current year.

6. Thereafter, Ms. Ankita Mishra Bundela, Deputy Secretary, (RMSA-IV), gave a detailed overview of the implementation of RMSA in the State. Copy of the presentation is placed at **Annexure-III**. In the presentation, various aspects of implementation of RMSA in the State including areas of concern, progress of recurring and non recurring interventions sanctioned under RMSA were highlighted and discussed in detail. It was pointed out that out of total 6028 secondary schools in the State, 68% of schools are run by the Government. 2309 (38%) secondary schools are with the Education Department and 1767(29%) secondary schools are run by Tribal Welfare Department. Only 2% of schools are government aided. Private unaided schools constitute 29% of the share.

Out of 27 districts in the State, 8 Districts are Special Focus Districts (ST concentrated).In addition 10 districts are left wing extremism affected .There are 74 Educationally Backward Blocks, of these 59 EBBs are in SFDs.

7. AREAS OF STRENGTH:

- i. The GER of the State has increased from 81.74% in 2012-13 to 87.06% in 2013-14. Enrolment of students in absolute numbers has also increased from 927532 to 979609 i.e. by 54,000 students.
- ii. The State has a Gross Access Ratio of 86.40%. Out of 21904 habitations, 18925 are covered by a secondary school within 5km distance. 2979 habitations are yet to be covered by secondary school. The State has projected a requirement of 858 in schools to achieve 100% access.
- iii. The State has implemented UDISE and has provided common codes for the elementary and secondary schools.
- iv. In 2013-14 the State has upgraded 107 middle schools to secondary level.

- v. The Pupil Teacher Ratio of the State has declined from 59 in 2012-13 to 45 in 2013-14. Student Classroom Ratio has decreased from 73 in 2012-13 to 70 in 2013-14. PTR and SCR are however still on the higher side as per RMSA norms.
- vi. Overall 73.3 % of training approved under RMSA have been implemented which higher than the national average.
- vii. A Manual for Training of SMDC members has been developed by the State.

8. AREAS OF CONCERN:

- i. In consistency is observed in educational indicators, whereas GER of the State has increased, the Retention Rate has marginally declined from 81.83% in 2012-13 to 80.76% in 2013-14 and the Transition Rate has also declined from 91.90% in 2012-13 to 89.05% in 2013-14. This needs to be verified by State.
- ii. The Gross Access Ratio at the State level in spite of recent up gradation of 107 schools by the State has not shown any increase in 2013-14 which needs to be verified.
- iii. The State has yet to undertake Curriculum and Textbook Reforms in accordance with NCF 2005.
- iv. Pass % of students in class 10th is very low. For the year 2013, it is 56.78% for regular students, 41.03% for private students and only 28.72% for students appearing through correspondence courses.
- v. Baseline survey for ascertaining learning levels of students enrolled in Class IXth conducted by SCERT, in 2013 indicates that 75 % of students do not have the desired learning levels of Class 8th students.
- vi. It was pointed out that approximately 17.43% of students in Class 9th are dropping out at the secondary level in Government schools which is disturbing. The State was requested to identify reasons for the huge drop out of students particularly amongst SC and ST students and devise

- appropriate strategies/initiate suitable measures to curb the trend and track the dropouts.
- vii. As per data provided by the State 51 % of sanctioned posts i.e. 13250 posts of teachers out of 25541 sanctioned posts are vacant in the State.
 - viii. As per UDISE 53.68% of teachers at the secondary level in government schools i.e. are trained.
 - ix. Slow progress is observed as regards recruitment of teachers approved for the newly upgraded schools under RMSA.
 - x. Progress of implementation of civil works is found to be slow. A huge spillover of 73% of approved civil works amounting to more than Rs 1000 cr is observed.
 - xi. Excess expenditure is observed under the salary head in 2013-14 for Headmasters and Lab Attendants against the approval of PAB which the State was asked to explain
 - xii. It is observed that a sum of Rs. 150 cr was transferred out of RMSA to SSA to pay for the salary of teachers which has now been recouped. It is also observed that a sum of Rs. 3.15 cr has been taken advances from other schemes. The State was advised by the PAB to refrain from inter Programme transfer of funds abide by the Financial Rules of Management.
 - xiii. Observations in audit report 2012-13, need to be responded by the State.

9. PROGRESS OF WORK UNDER RMSA:

(I) NON RECURRING:

Under RMSA, the State has been sanctioned up gradation of 1347 schools, strengthening of 1641 schools, construction of 405 Teachers Quarters, major repairs of 325 schools.

As regards physical progress, the State has taken up 41.84% of the total approved works, out of which 26.15 % have been completed and 15.69% are in progress.58.15% works have yet to be taken up.

Out of total approved outlay of Rs 1371.84 cr and Central Share of Rs. 1028.88 cr, Rs 767.24 cr has been released to the State. Out of this Rs. 142.46 cr have been released in 2013-14. As per UC submitted by the State vide letter dated 13.12.2013 Rs. 426.57 cr has been utilized which is 31% of total approved outlay.

Secretary Education explained that the work is being carried out through PWD and the monitoring is being done through District Collectors and the same shall be expeditiously completed.

(II) RECURRING:

In 2013-14, Rs 110.29 cr was approved for recurring interventions under RMSA with a Central share of Rs. 82.72 cr. In 2013-14 Rs. 44.47 cr was released by the Ministry. The State has reported an expenditure of Rs 105.27 cr which is 95 % of the approved outlay.

As per progress of works submitted by the State, funds for salaries of teachers, headmasters, lab attendants, school grants, minor repair grants, training of headmasters and teachers and special teaching for learning enhancement have been utilized. In fact the State has spent more than the approved amount for the salaries of headmasters and lab attendants .The State was asked to explain the same. Funds for organizing book fairs and training of SMDC members have not been utilized.

10. ANNUAL WORK PLAN AND BUDGET FOR 2014-15:

The proposals of the State for the year 2014-15 were discussed at length, intervention wise and the following decisions were taken as detailed below: The costing sheet is placed at **Annexure-IV**.

(i) Up gradation of New Schools: The proposal of the State for up gradation of 344 two section schools to the secondary level was considered by the PAB and in view of huge spill over of 73% of civil works, the State was advised to first complete the pending civil works and liquidate past liabilities and then revert with fresh proposal.

As regards change in location of 4 schools approved for up gradation in 2010-11, since the schools conform to the distance and enrolment norm of RMSA, the same was agreed to by the PAB as a onetime exception .It was however clarified that no such changes shall be considered in future. List of change in location of 4 schools is placed at **Annexure-V**.

(ii) Construction of schools by Using Pre Fabricated Structures:

The proposal of the State for using pre fabricated structure for construction of the previously approved 90 new schools(04 in 2009-10, 18 in 2010-11 & 68 in 2011-12) , strengthening of 125 schools (07 in 2010-11 & 118 from 2011-12) and construction of 67 residential teachers quarters in 28 schools approved in 2011-12 was considered by the PAB.

It was pointed out that all the proposed schools are located in remote areas of the 7 left wing extremism affected districts of the Bastar Division, where the State is finding it difficult to take up regular construction works due to activities of extremists. The State submitted that the construction of buildings will be taken up as per RMSA norms and additional funds if any required will be provided by the State Government. The State also informed that the construction will be taken up through the NCETAR (North East Center For Technology Application and Reach) under the Department of Science and Technology Government of India.

The PAB noted that that in the year 2010-11 on the request of the

	<p>State the PAB had approved up gradation of 14 porta cabin schools in three left wing affected districts but in the subsequent year the State expressed its inability to run these schools if the residential facility was not provided. It was also noted that under SSA the State has already been permitted to construct pre fabricated structures.</p> <p>On the request of the State, in view the problems being faced in the left wing extremist affected areas, as a special case, the PAB agreed to the construction of <u>90 new secondary schools, strengthening of 125 schools and construction of 67 teacher’s residential quarters as proposed by the State.</u> While clarifying that no additional funds will be provided by the Ministry for the above schools and the State was advised to conform to components and dimensions as approved under the Programme and durability of the pre structures. List of schools approved for construction using pre-fabricated structures is placed at Annexure-VI.</p>
2.	<p>Strengthening Of Existing Government Schools And Construction Of Teachers Quarters:</p> <p>The proposal of the State for strengthening 552 existing secondary schools and construction of 60 teachers’ quarters was considered by the PAB and in view of huge spill over of civil works against earlier approvals the State was advised to first complete the pending civil works and liquidate past liabilities before seeking fresh sanctions.</p> <p>As regards schools approved for strengthening under RMSA in the previous years, PAB agreed to the cancellation of one school Govt. Secondary School, Junwani Bhilai UDISE 22100721110 since as per UDISE though the school appears in the list of schools strengthened however no component has been approved in the above school.</p>

- (iii) **Special Teaching for Learning Enhancement:** The proposal for organizing special teaching for learning enhancement for 84,400 students of Class 9th in Government Secondary schools (20% of the enrolment in Class 9th in Govt. Secondary schools) @ Rs. 500/- per student was considered and approved. The State was advised to devise a clear strategy on the basis of assessment of learning levels conducted by the State/NCERT and further undertake an internal evaluation of the impact of the activity in terms of improving the learning outcomes of the children who have been administered the special teaching and share the same with the Ministry. List of such children identified school wise must also be provided by the State.
- (v) **Special Teaching for Learning Enhancement For Class Xth Students:** The proposal of the State to provide Special teaching for learning enhancement for 20,400 Class 10th students @ 500 per student was considered and the State was advised to converge it with the intervention approved above.
- (vi) **Learning Achievement Survey Of Class IXth Students:** The proposal of the State to conduct a Baseline Survey of all Class 9th students for assessing the learning achievement of students was considered by the PAB and since the State has already conducted the Survey in August 2013 though SCERT PAB advised the State to devise necessary strategies to improve the learning levels of the students in light of the findings of the Survey before conducting another Survey. Further the State

	<p>was advised to examine closely the findings of the National Achievement Survey carried out by NCERT for Class 8th students in Chhattisgarh and was also requested to cooperate with NCERT in conduct of the National Assessment Survey for Class 10th students.</p> <p>(vi) Art and Cultural Activities: The proposal for organizing cultural activities in 27 districts @ Rs. 20,000/- per district was considered and the State was advised to take up such activities out of the annual school grants which has an enabling provision to this effect.</p> <p>(vii) Provision of Sports Equipment's For Govt. Secondary Schools: Proposal for provision of Sports Equipment's for 550 Govt. Secondary schools @ Rs. 25,000 per school was considered and <u>approved for 100 Govt. Secondary schools @ Rs. 20,000 per school as per RMSA norms.</u> The State was requested to provide the list of schools. The PAB advised the State to ensure the procurement of quality assured sports equipments as per NCERT standard through decentralized mode.</p>

11. IEDSS

It was observed by the PAB, that States have not been able to give detailed proposals under IEDSS and in most cases it has been totally left to the NGOs to formulate and implement the proposals. States have completely disengaged themselves of their role and responsibility as the main implementation agency. States are, in many cases forwarding proposals of the NGOs without any diligence at their level which is contrary to the spirit of the Scheme.

PAB also noted that since a major financial recurring component of the scheme is of salary for special teachers, the States have to ensure that their annual proposal incorporates and substantiates in detail State's commitments. The commitment of GoI will be subject to it being approved as part of the AWP& B and will be limited to the year in which it is approved.

In light of limited availability of funds and the fact that recurring grants lapse at the end of FY, reimbursements will not be entertained beyond the FY unless and until it is specifically sought and more importantly approved and re-validated by the PAB. However, in no case, proposals not approved in previous years including teacher's salary will be considered for reimbursement.

NON-RECURRING

The State Govt. proposed non-recurring grant for resource rooms, equipment of resource rooms, and toilets for CWSN etc.

The State Govt. was approved NR works at a cost of Rs. 471.25 lakh and Rs. 253.55 lakh has been released but with no progress reported till date. The State was advised to take up the civil works under RMSA core component and to surrender the remaining amount if no work has been undertaken. Detail to be shared within a month, failing which the approval for 2013-14 to that extent would stand revoked. In view of the lack of progress, new components proposed by State were not considered for approval.

RECURRING

The State Govt. proposed recurring grant for student oriented components, salary of special education teachers, in-service training of teachers etc.

(A) Student oriented component

- i) The recurring component for providing aids and appliances at the outlay of **Rs. 13.79 lakh** for 1379 CWSN @ Rs.1000/- **subject to State Govt. furnishing** the list of CWSN who needs aids and appliances and actual cost of aids and appliances.
- ii) To Organise for assessment camp for 2541 CWSN @ 200/-per camp with a total outlay of **Rs.5.08 lakh.**
- iii) Braille books for visionless for 160 blind CWSN. The total outlay of **Rs.1.60 lakh** is approved subject to State Govt. furnishing the actual cost of books with the list/name of CWSN who needed this book.
- iv) Uniform for 5922 CWSN @ Rs.600 per CWSN at the cost of **Rs. 35.53 lakh.**
- v) Transport allowance to 160 blind CWSN @ Rs. 1000 per CWSN for 10 months at a total cost of **Rs. 1.60 lakh.**

- vi) Escort Allowance for 171 CWSN in respect of CP 30 Autism 28 and multiple disability 113 for 10 months with a total cost of **Rs. 1.71 lakh subject to State Govt. furnishing list of these CWSN and name of schools along with UDISE code where they are studying.**
- vii) Reader Allowance for 160 blind CWSN for 10 months @ Rs.100 per month with a total cost of **Rs. 1.6 lakh.**
- viii) Stipend for 2642 girls students for 10 months @ Rs.200 per month with the total outlay of **Rs. 52.84 lakh.**

(B) **Other components.**

- (i) 10 days Braille training for existing 52 general teachers at a cost of Rs.300 per day approved with a total outlay of **Rs.1.56 lakh.**
- (ii) 10 days sign language training for existing 50 general teachers for 10 days @ Rs.300 per day approved with a total outlay of **Rs. 1.50 lakh.**

Since the Scheme does not provide the provision for sports training camp, workshop for module preparation and Workshop on TLM existing teachers, therefore proposal not approved.

The total outlay under recurring component approved for 2014-15 comes to **Rs. 116.81 lakh.** The costing sheet is placed at **Annexure-IV.**

12. GIRLS HOSTEL

NON RECURRING

The State Govt. submitted proposal for sanction of Rs. 1798.20 lakhs for construction of boundary wall, boring hand pump, furniture and equipment including bedding and kitchen equipment for all the 74 girls' hostels. The state submitted similar proposal for NR grant of Rs. 2305.80

lakhs to the PAB 2013-14 for the identical items for all the 74 girls' hostels. The State was informed that Rs. 1.50 lakhs towards the cost of boundary wall, Rs. 1.00 lakhs for boring hand pump and Rs. 6.91 lakhs for furniture, equipment, bedding etc. per hostel had been included in the Non Recurring grant already released to the State. Therefore, **PAB did not approve the present proposal for sanction of NR Grant.**

During the course of deliberations, the issue of sanction of Rs. 5.00 lakh each for construction of approach road in 9 EBBs in which 9 hostels were sanctioned at State SORs during 2011-12 came up and was discussed at length. Since the provisions under the Scheme do not permit Central grant for approach road, the PAB revoked the approval accorded and cancelled the grant released for the approach road vide sanction dated 19.11.2011.

RECURRING

The State Govt. submitted proposal for sanction of recurring grant of Rs. 1277.98 lakhs for a period of 12 months for all the 74 Girls' Hostels. The State requested that the wages of Chowkidar, Head Cook and Asstt. Cook may be paid at prevalent rates as per Minimum Wages Act of the State, the copy of the notification which was also provided to the GOI during the course of discussions.

The PAB approved recurring grant of Rs. 630.52 lakhs as per the Scheme norms. This included wages as per the extant rates of Minimum Wages Act of Chhattisgarh.

13. ICT@SCHOOL

PAB was informed that till date, 2200 schools were approved for coverage under ICT@ Schools Scheme in the year 2005-06 (100 schools), 2007-08 (200 schools), 2008-09 (800 schools) and 2009-10 (1100 schools). Out of the total amount of Rs. 11000.00 lakh towards Central Share, Rs. 2700

lakh has been released with a committed liability amounting to Rs. 8300 lakh. However, out of the 2200 schools approved in the indicated years, UDISE code discrepancy found in 1 school. With regard to the said discrepancy it was decided state will clarify the details of the schools (name, location, Government or Government aided, secondary /higher secondary /middle school, etc) along with the UDISE code. The detailed status is as under:

Issues:-

It was also indicated that further release of committed liability/expenditure in respect of schools approved will be subject to State Govt. utilizing the amount available with the state and providing the Utilization Certificate (UC), Comprehensive /Progress Report and Third party Evaluation Report indicating the status of implementation of

ICT scheme in the State. State is also yet to send the U.C. for the Amount of Rs. 1200.00 Lakh released in 2008-09.

In view of state showing no progress in the implementation of the scheme in 1100 schools approved in 2009-10, no new proposal is approved for the year 2014-15.

14. VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

The PAB noted that during 2013-14 introduction of vocational education in 25 schools in Chhattisgarh from Class 9th onwards in the academic session 2013-14 was approved under the CSS of VHSE in NOS compliant job roles in three trades, namely – IT/ITeS (Assistant Help Desk Assistant), Automobile (Service Technician) and Retail (Sales Associate) for an approved outlay of **Rs. 674.23 lakh** with Central Share of **Rs. 644.98 lakh**. Out of this, **Rs. 322.49 lakh** has been released to the Government of Chhattisgarh as 1st installment.

The State Government informed that the Scheme could not be implemented in the 2013-14 on account of completion of pre project activities like notification regarding scheme of subjects, etc and will now be done from the academic session 2014-15.

As regards the Scheme of subjects it was informed that the State Board of Education has decided to offer vocational education as a seventh subject besides the six compulsory subjects in Class 9th and 10th. The final result will be declared on the basis of highest marks obtained in 6 subjects. In class 11th and 12th the subject will be offered in lieu of third language.

The PAB clarified that as per the scheme vocational education should be taught as an additional subject (6th subject) in Class 9th and 10th and as

a compulsory elective subject in Class 11th and 12th. The importance of assigning sufficient teaching and learning hours to the subject, raising the stature of vocational education at par with other subjects while creating clear pathways for developing skill proficiency within the education system was explained to the State team. The State was advised to take up the matter with the Board of Education and firm up the scheme of subjects on the above lines under intimation to the Ministry before the start of the next academic session.

As regards translation of curriculum and courseware in Hindi, the State was informed that PSSCIVE has already initiated action and the translated versions of courseware may be obtained from the Institute.

In view of the revision of the Scheme as approved by the Cabinet, on 12th Feb 2014, and the fact that the State will be implementing the scheme in academic year 2014-15, the total outlay for implementation of the Scheme in the **25** schools in 2014-15 as per revised norms was approved by the PAB for an amount of **Rs. 419.13 lakh** on **75:25** Centre-State sharing basis with a central share of **Rs. 314.35 lakh** as per financial estimates placed at **Annexure-IV**. The PAB noted that an amount of **Rs. 322.49 lakh** has already been released to the Government of Chhattisgarh which will be adjusted against releases due in 2014-15.

As regards the State's proposal for implementation of the scheme in 100 new schools from the year 2014-15, the State was advised to first revise the scheme of subjects as per the requirement of the scheme and implement the scheme successfully in 25 schools already approved before proposing for an expansion. List of 25 schools approved for implementation of the Scheme is placed at **Annexure-VII**.

- 15.** Based on above approvals accorded for various interventions in respect of all 5 Schemes, the total interventions amounting to **Rs.**

14946.33 lakh including the non-recurring interventions amounting to **Rs. 173.00** and recurring interventions amounting to **Rs. 14773.33 lakh** with the Central Share amounting to **Rs. 11333.53 lakh** and State share of **Rs. 3612.80 lakh** have been approved. The MMER in respect of all these Schemes for the approved interventions will come to **Rs. 505.43 lakh**. The spillover from previous approvals (of Non -Recurring grants) and committed liabilities as against it was noted with reference to further releases of non-recurring grants to the State. The Scheme-wise depiction of the proposals of the State and approvals accorded by PAB in financial term is capitulated in the following table:

16. The release of funds to different schemes including the committed liability as against previous approvals, will be further guided by the following conditions:

- (i) The State/UT Administration shall give a written commitment for meeting its share of the RMSA, ICT@ school, IEDSS, Girls Hostel &

Vocational Education of the budget approved according to prescribed sharing pattern of the schemes.

- (ii) SMDCs or equivalent bodies should be constituted and accounts opened to incur expenditure under school grant, minor repair, civil works, and other such expenditure, which have to be incurred only through these bodies as per RMSA norms.
- (iii) The second installment would only be released after (a) the proportionate installment of State/UT share has been released, (b) at least 50% expenditure against available funds has been incurred, (c) utilization certificate has been submitted for funds released in the year 2013-14 and (d) Audit Reports have been submitted for the year 2012-13.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

The focus of this section is on the major indicators of secondary education. This includes Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER), Net Enrolment Ratio (NER), Dropout Rate, Retention rate and Transition Rate etc.

UDISE

The state has used UDISE 2013-14 data for preparation of Annual Work Plan 2014-15.

Enrolment

The total Enrolment at state level in all secondary schools in the year 2013-14 is 979609, out of which 488130 are boys and 491479 are girls. The representation of boys and girls in the total enrolment is 49.83% and 50.17% respectively. The enrolment of Boys and Girls has increased by 5.08% and 6.15% respectively. The enrolment in the year 2013-14 has increased from 927532 (5.16%) from previous year. The enrolment has also increased considerably from 648775 in 2010-11 (22.55%) SSE.

The SCR at state level is 70, which has decreased from 73 in last year. The districts having high SCR viz. Balodabazar 107, Mungeli 105, Bemetara 95, Basatra 89 and Dhantari 88 need more classrooms.

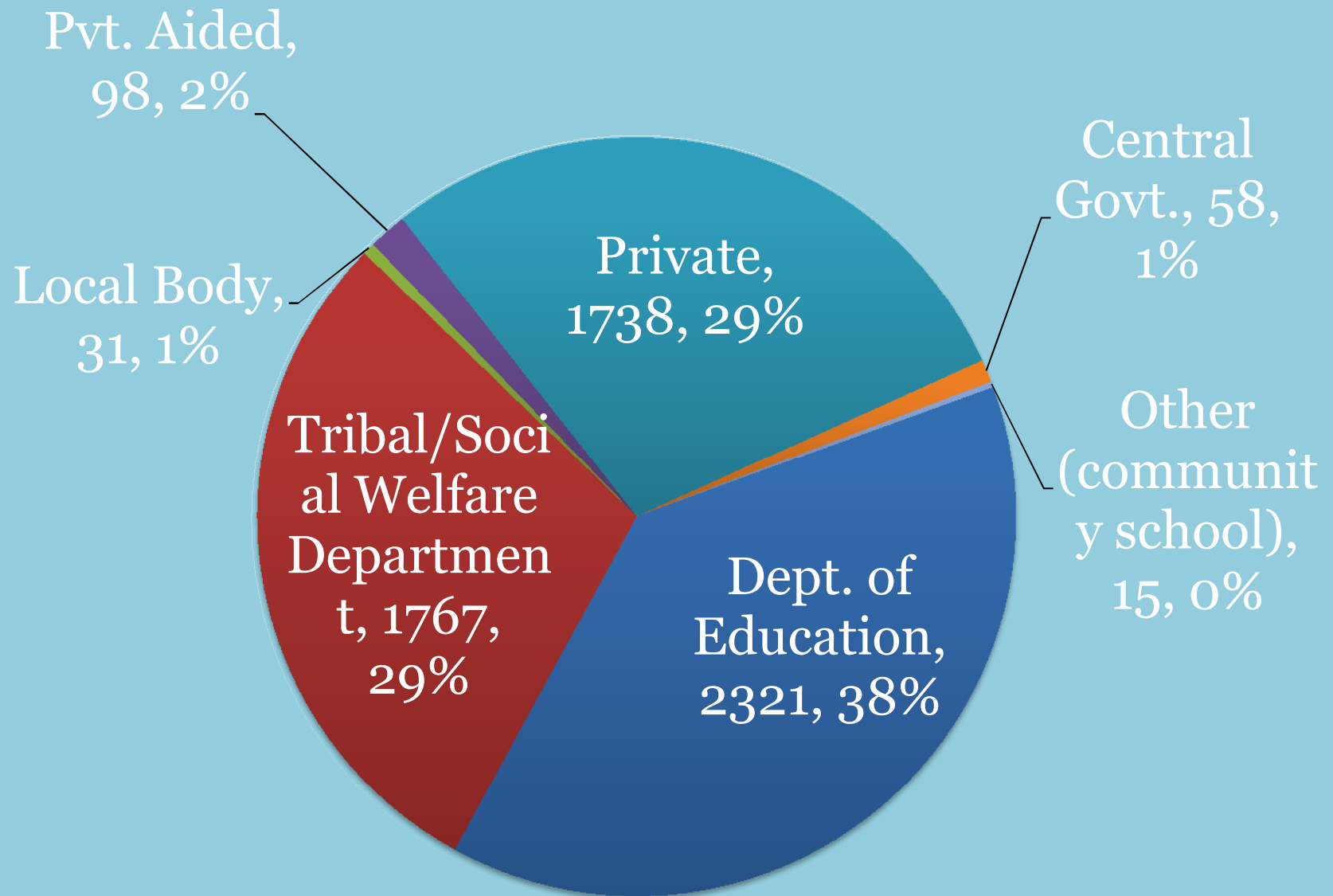

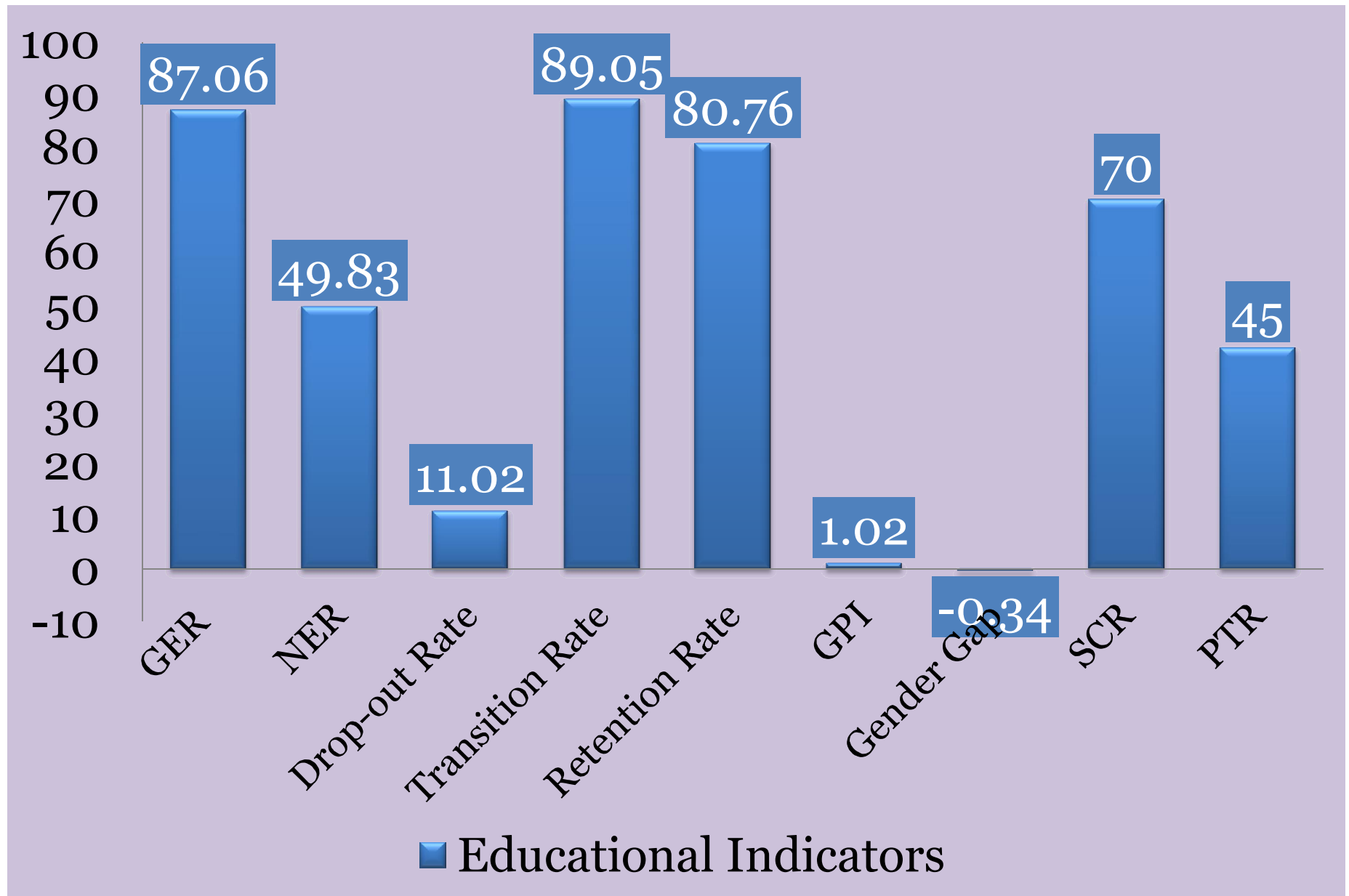

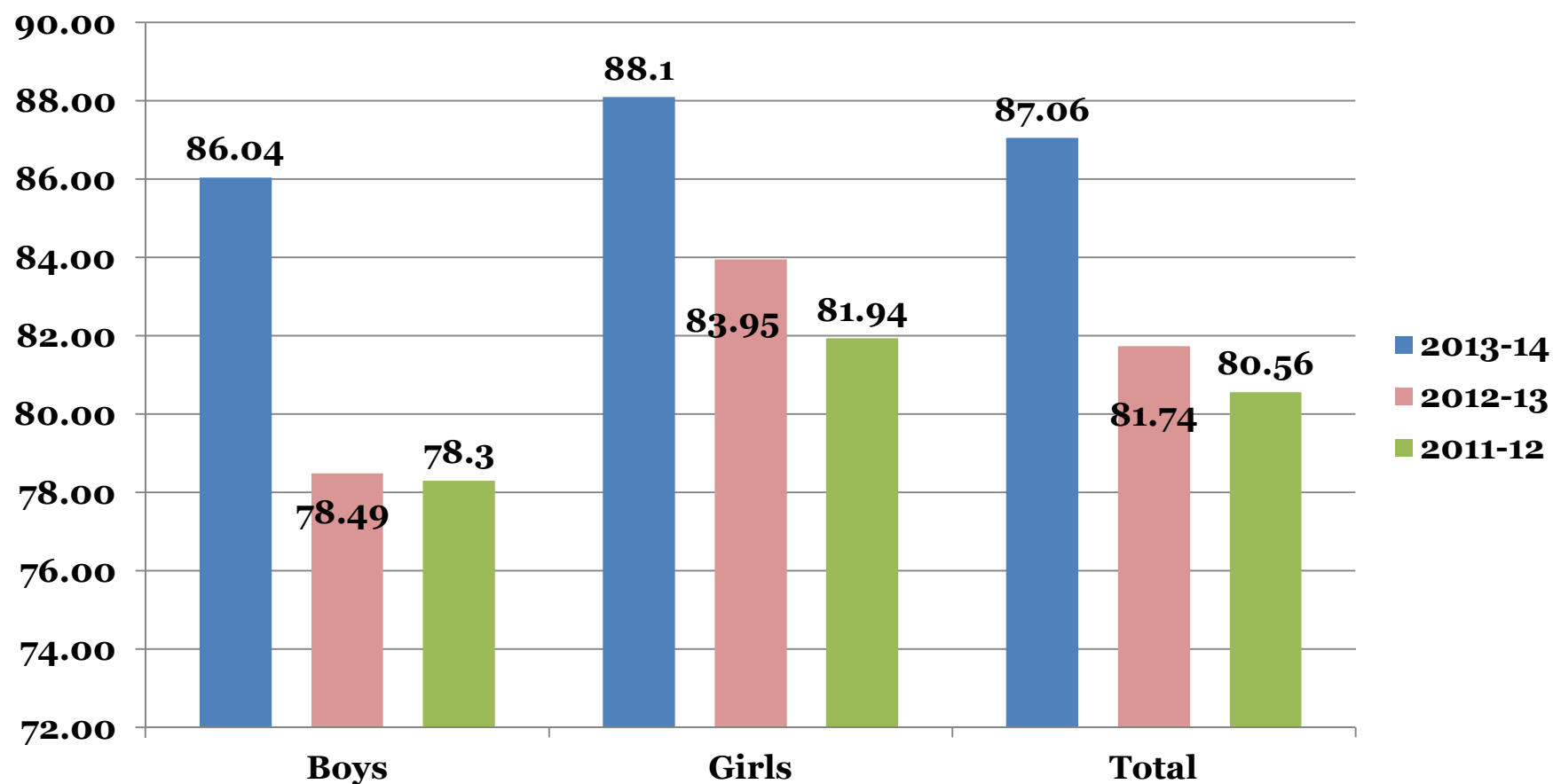

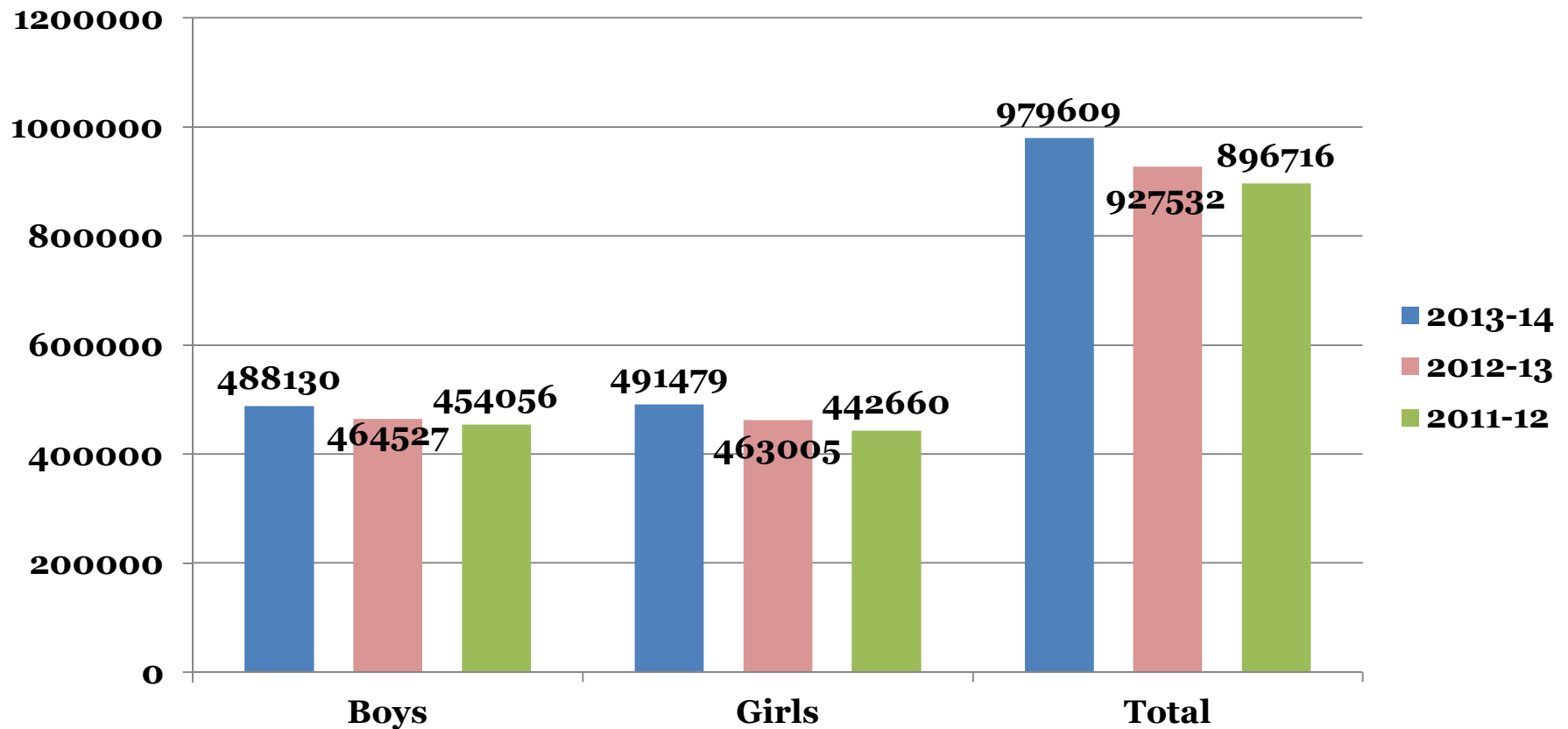
Gross Enrolment Ratio (Secondary level)

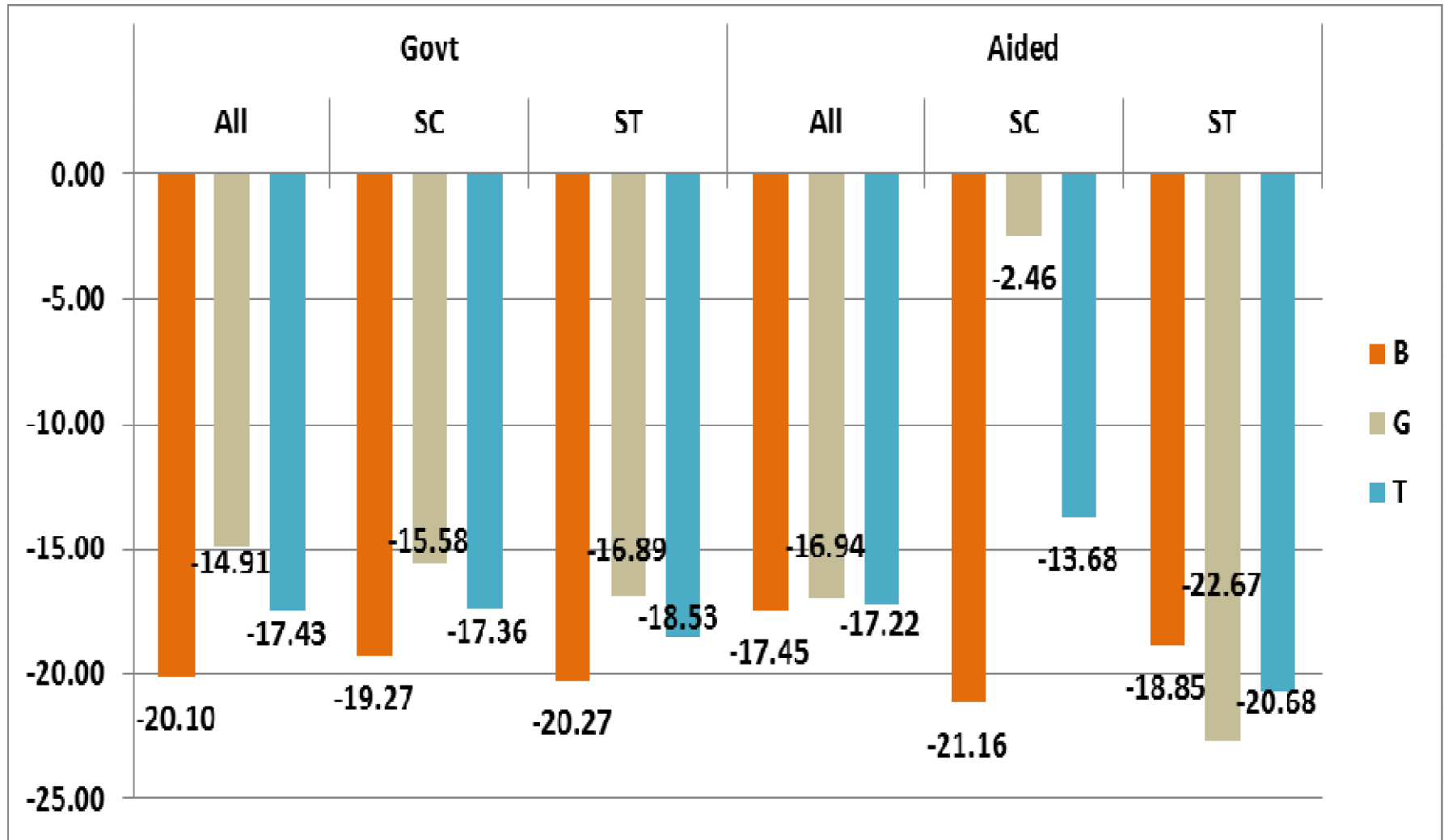
Enrolment (Secondary level)

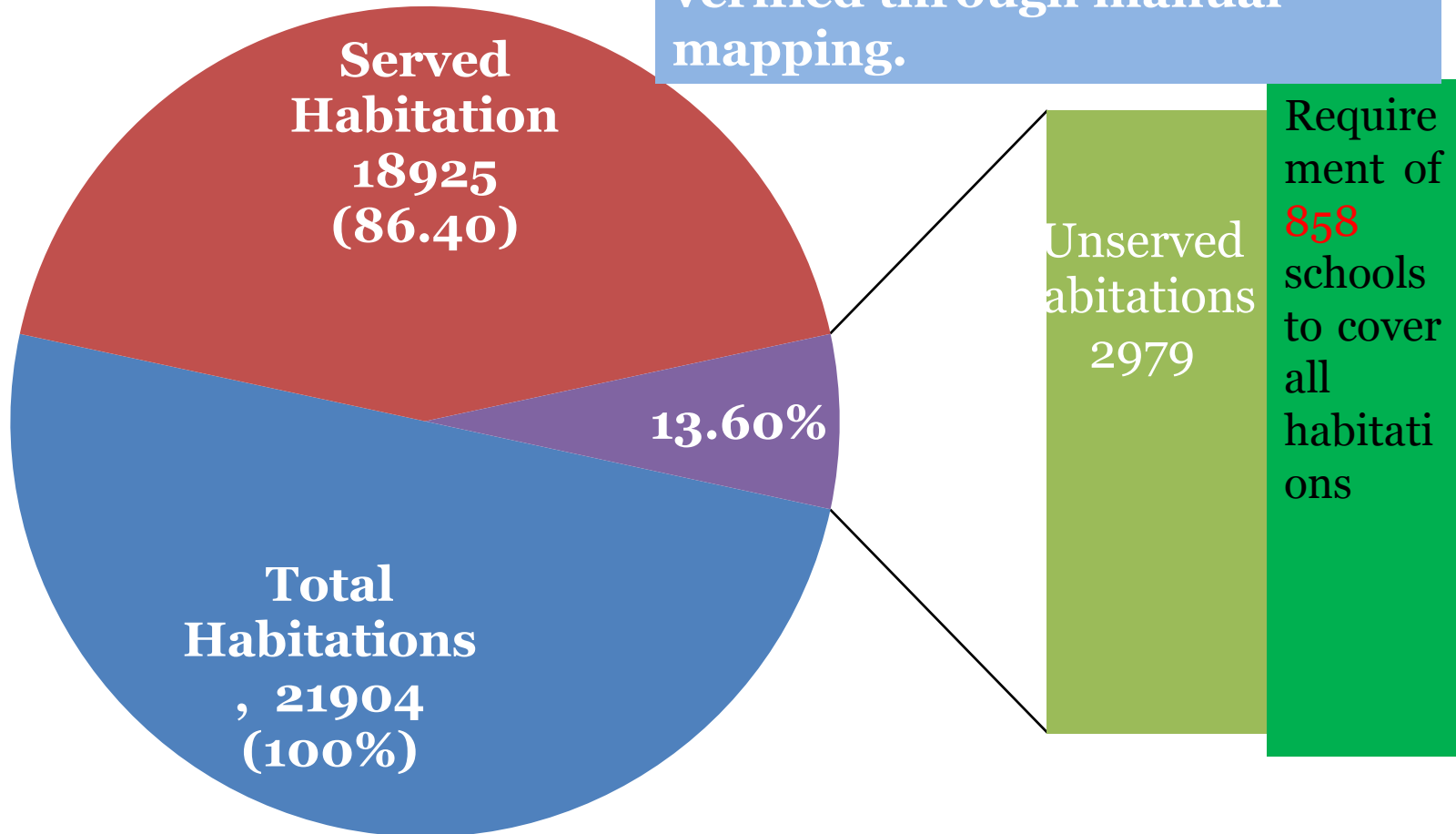

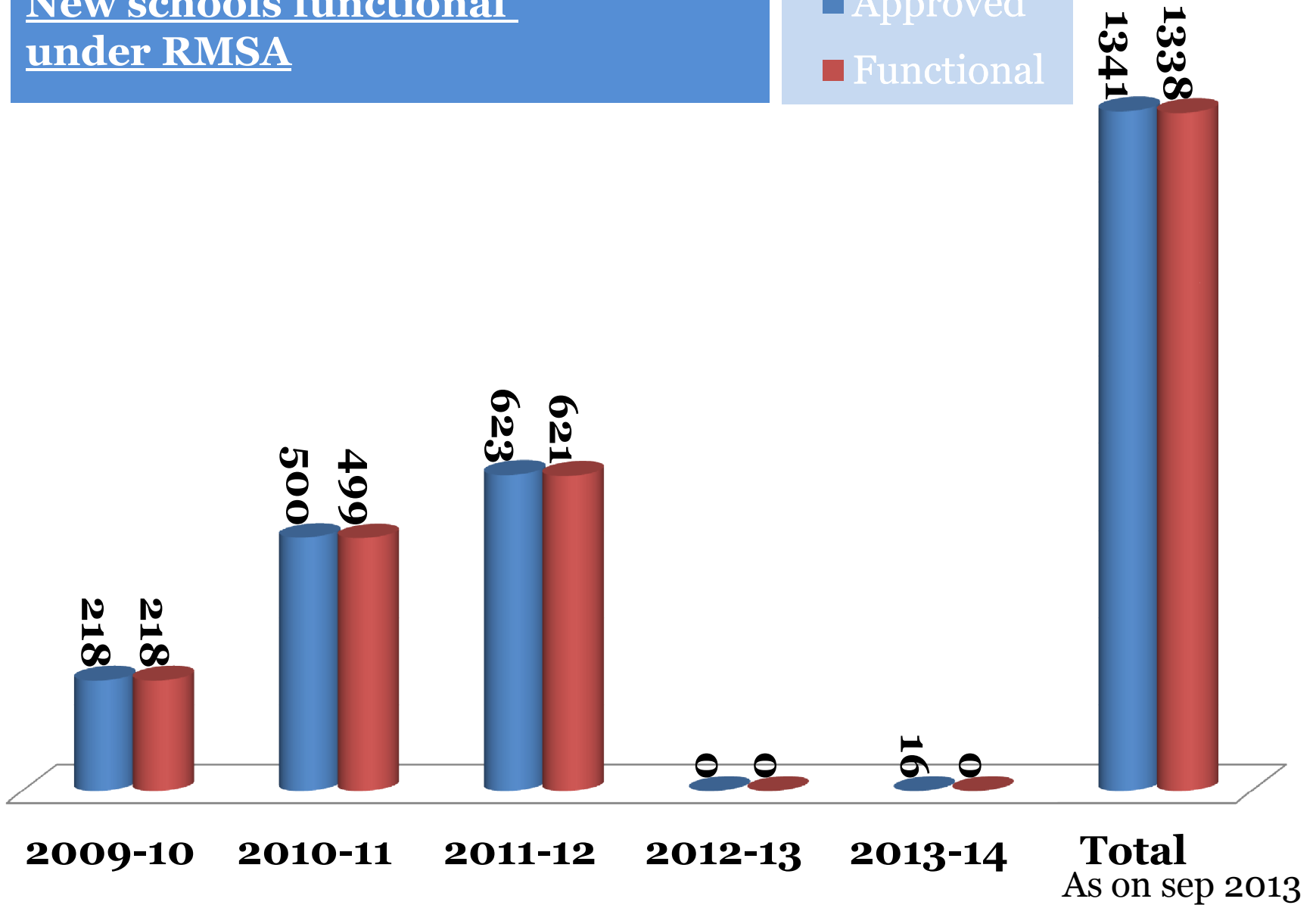

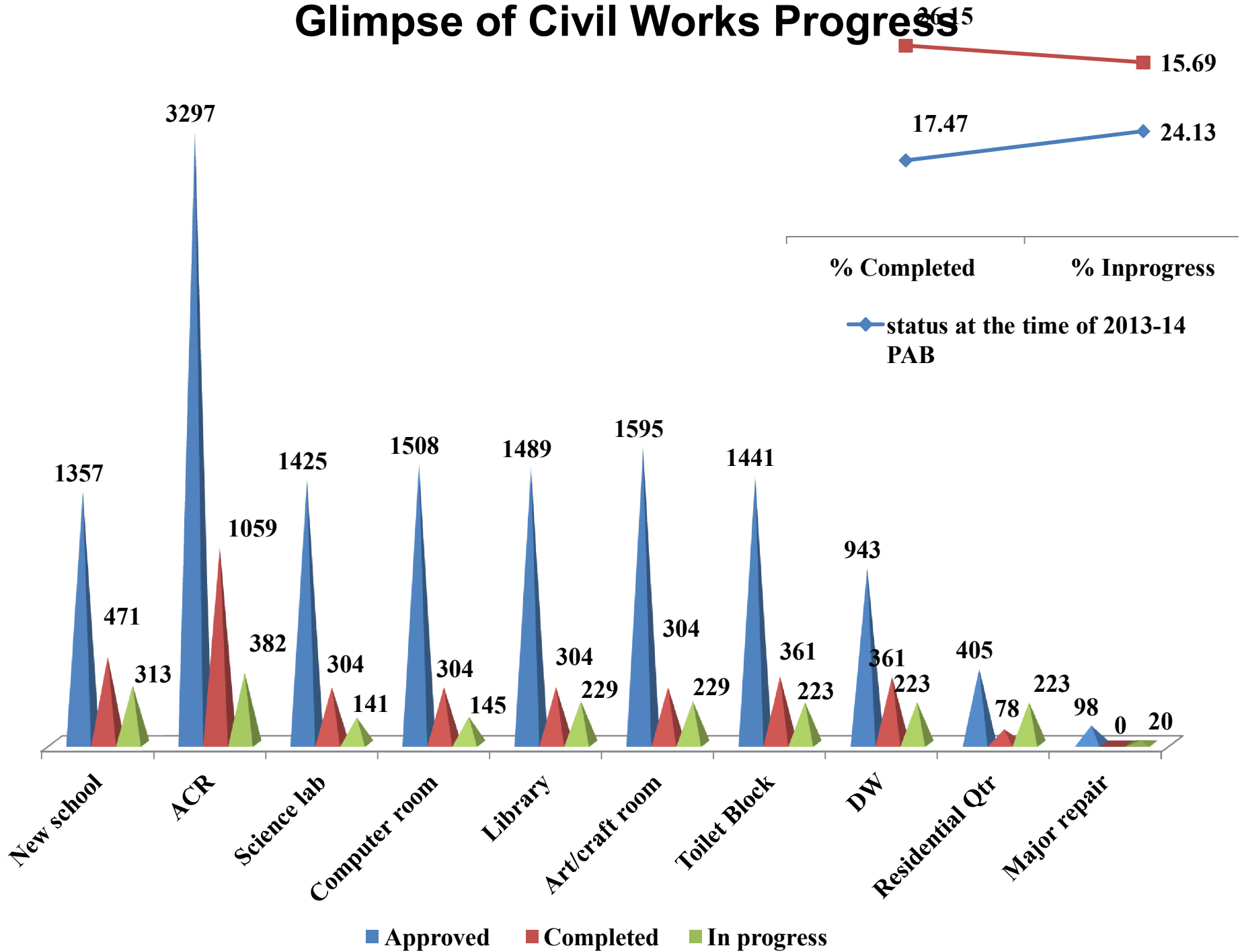

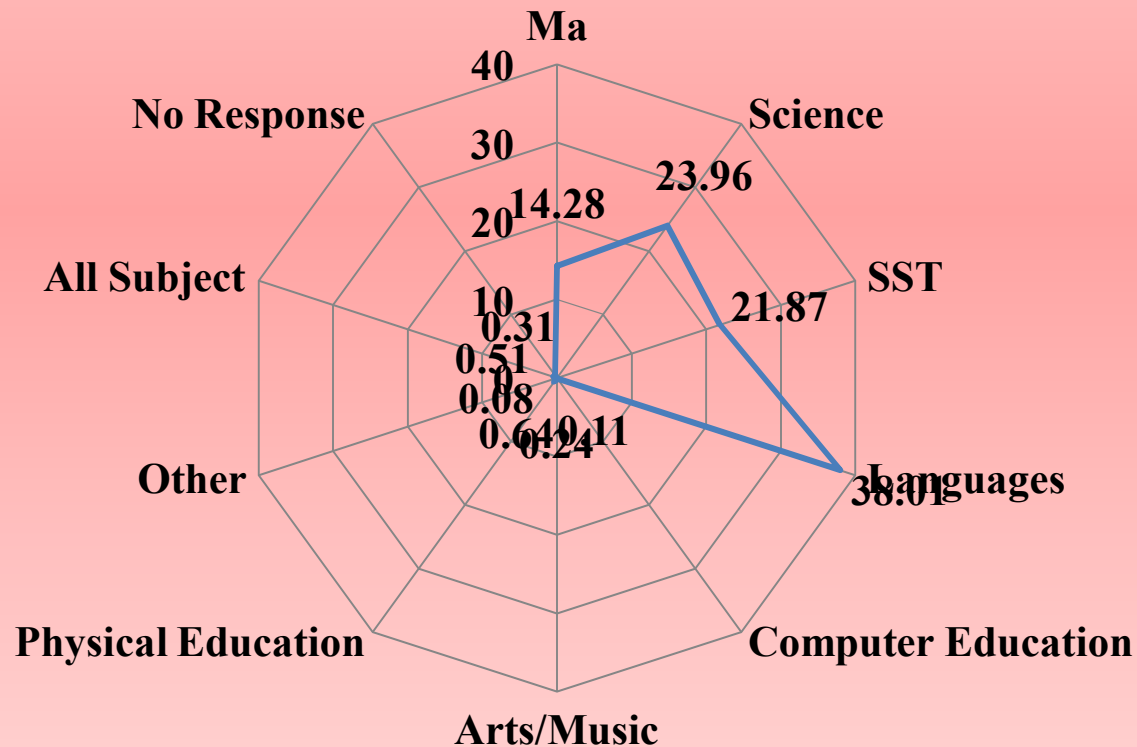

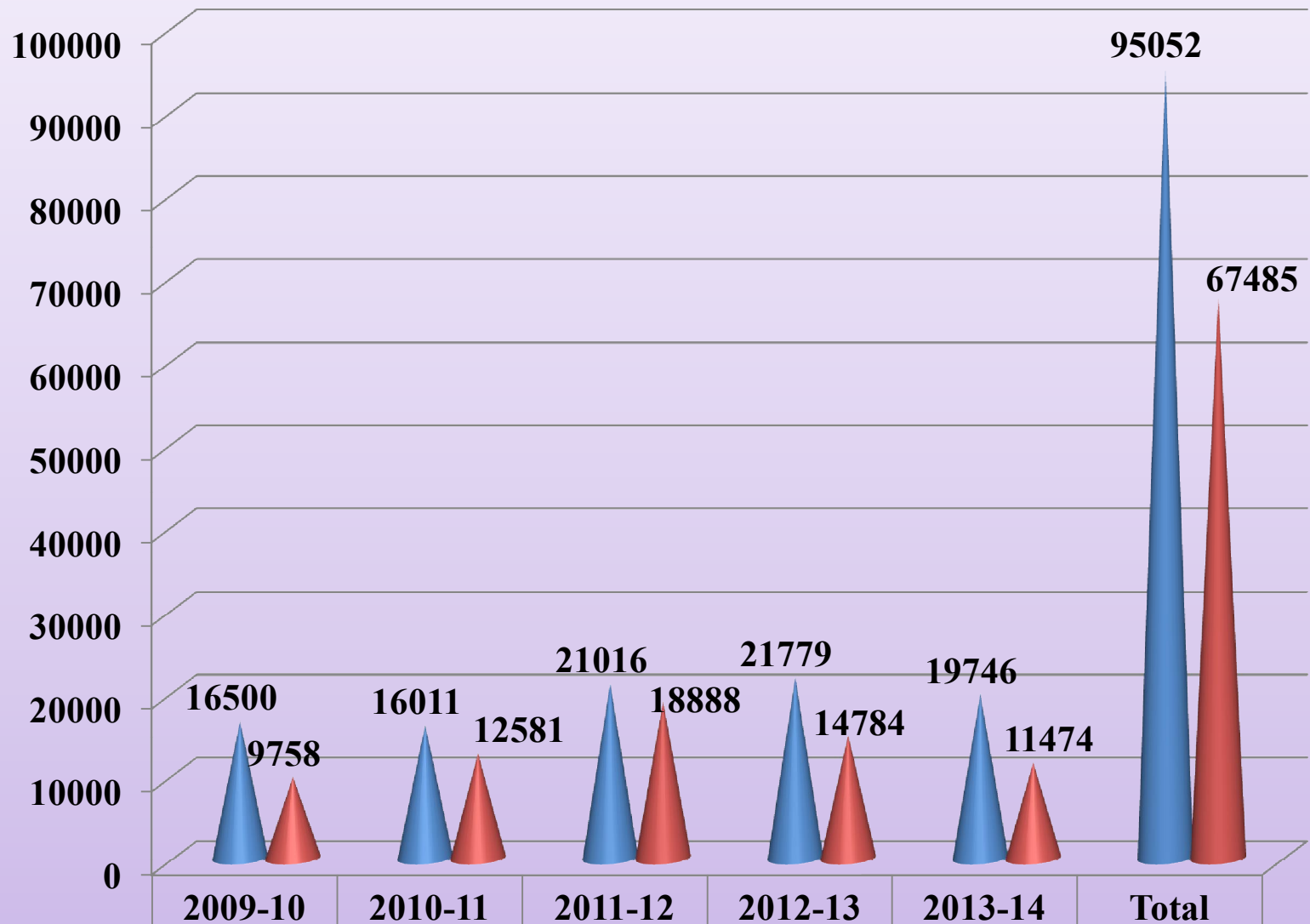


Vacant Teaching Posts under State Govt. & Progress of Recruitment in New Schools

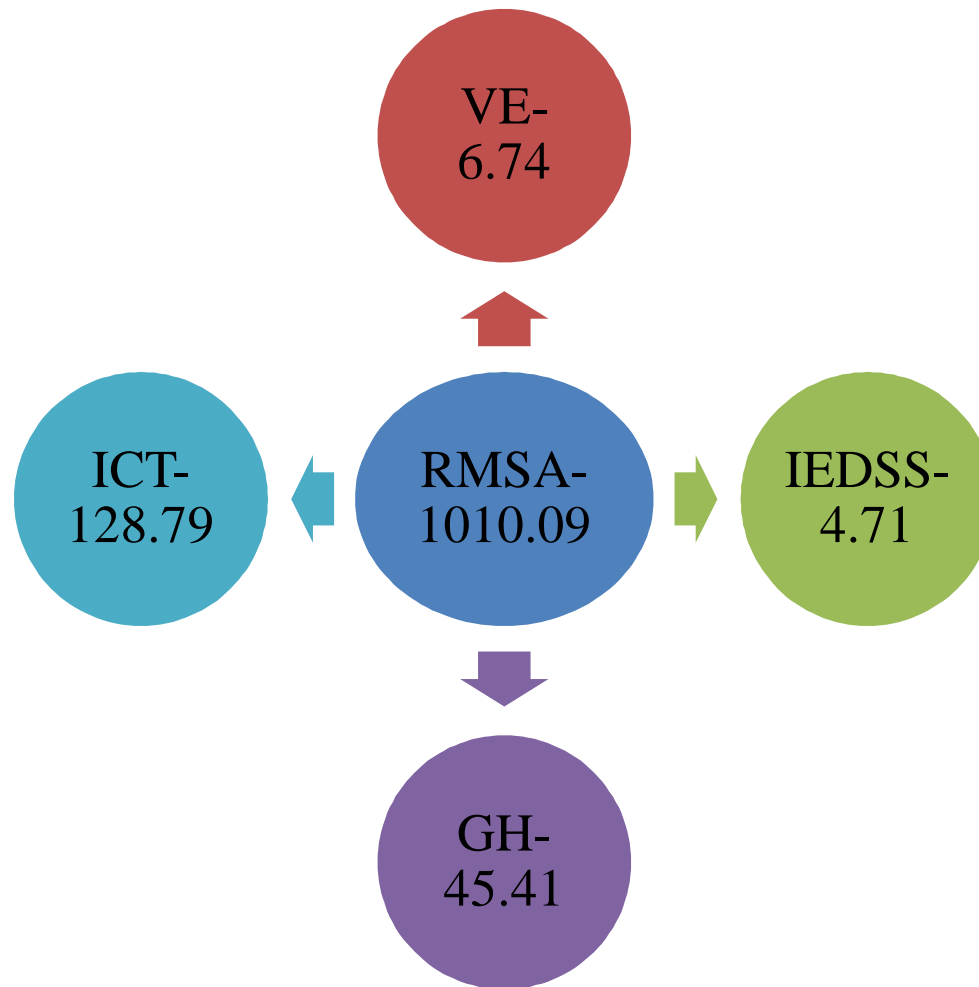
