Minutes of the 24th Project Approval Board (PAB) (3rd Integrated RMSA) held on 20th May, 2013 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 of the state of Gujarat

- 1. The 24th meeting of the PAB (3rd Integrated RMSA) for considering the Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 for the state of **Gujarat**, Himachal Pradesh and Rajasthan in respect of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), ICT@ Schools (ICT), Girls' Hostels (GH), Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary Stage (IEDSS), Vocational Education (VE) and the proposal of National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) was held on 20th May, 2013 under the Chairpersonship of Shri. R. Bhattacharya, Secretary (SE&L).
- 2. The list of participants who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure-I.

Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA)

- 3. At the outset, the Secretary (SE&L) welcomed the participants. He then proceeded to review the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) activities and progress of the States in respect of the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of National Means and Merit Scholarship (NMMS) and National Scheme of Incentive for Girls (NSIGSE). He also reviewed the status of Annual Plan Provisions of the States in respect of School Education.
- 4. Secretary (SE&L) stated that the Govt of India has favourably considered various long pending demands of the States and UTs in respect of adoption of State Schedule of Rates (SoR) in civil works, enhancement of percentage of Management, Monitoring, Evaluation and Research(MMER), continuance of 75:25 sharing pattern between Centre and States (90:10 for the North East) and extension of quality related interventions of the scheme to Government aided schools. He also clarified that the revised norms relating to applicability of SoR and enhanced MMER provisions will be applicable prospectively. Secretary (SE&L) has also



requested the States to make an effort to bring convergence at school level in planning. Further he also informed that due to the limited availability of funds under RMSA, priority will be given to access with co-related priority to committed approval for teachers salary. In so far as fund flow towards salary component is concerned, the funds will be released against the posts sanctioned only after the state Govt. confirms by providing requisite documents of recruiting the personnel and placing them in position.

 Ms Caralyn Khongwar Deshmukh, Director (RMSA I) then presented the status of the state in the secondary sector. A copy of presentation is at Annexure II.

Areas of Strength

6. The Annual Work Plan 2013-14 of Gujarat places emphasis on the qualitative interventions in the schools of Gujarat. As part of the quality drive, Gujarat has taken various initiatives, like the Gunutsav exercise in which almost the whole State machinery is involved in an extensive and intensive exercise to survey, assess and report on the status of schools and also take follow up necessary action to address and improve quality activities in the schools in Gujarat.

Areas of Concern:

- There is no connection of the AWP&B write up with the data given in the plan and with the UDISE/ SEMIS data. There is also huge discrepancy within the UDISE data.
- 8. GER is 65.63% (which decreased from 70.17% last year) and NER is 57.64% in the State of Gujarat. However, GER in the districts of Kutch (15.53%), Surendranagar (40.14%) and Bhavnagar (48.04%), NER in the districts of Gandhinagar (10.36%), Patan (45.18%) and Ahmedabad (45.28%) and the Drop- out rate in the districts of Banaskantha (17.70%), Amreli (15.10%) and Kutch (14.86%) need special attention. The dropout rate in districts of Junagarh at 41.29% and in Kutch at 46.93% also need special attention.



9. Due to data discrepancies, no decision could be taken with regard to approval for opening of new schools. The number of teachers as per data given by the State varies from the State's UDISE data. Since the same situation is reflected with regard to ICT @ Schools, no recommendation could be made for any approval. The Principal Secretary, Gujarat requested for time to correct the UDISE data, which the PAB acquiesced to. (Note: The revised proposal was received from Gujarat on 17th June 2013, and data with regard to ICT @ School was received on the 24th July 2013).

Special Focus Districts (SFD) and Convergence:

10. Out of 27 districts in Gujarat, 6 districts are Special Focus Districts (SFDs -ST) and there are 85 Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) in the State. The details of approval for SFD are at Annexure III. Under RMSA, 78 new schools and strengthening of 29 existing secondary schools have been approved till 2012-13. In these six SFDs. 1213 schools have also been covered under ICT @ schools, till 2012-13. Since no new school and teacher quarter approved under RMSA during 2013-14, the coverage in SFDs is nil. Further, coverage of schools under ICT @ school is also nil during 2013-14 due to non-approval of fresh proposal.

Status of Integration of Schemes at School level:

11. In view of the discrepancy in the UDISE data, the status on the integration of schemes and convergence at School level, ie, whether a school has been covered under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of the Government of India could not be worked out.

Progress under RMSA:

- 12. **Recurring:** State of Gujarat had spent only 19% of recurring approved activities with only 1% progress under the in-service training for existing teachers and nil progress for training of Headmasters, KRPs and Master Trainers.
- Non Recurring: The State has nil progress under non-recurring activities.



Issues:

- 14.1. The Annual Work Plan of Gujarat proposed for upgradation of school is not based on U-DISE data but on a different set of data culled out from the Gunutsav exercise which the Gujarat Government has undertaken. Therefore, the appraisal on the basis of UDISE would not take place.
- 14.2. In the year 2010-11, Gujarat had proposed for opening of 644 schools to cover the identified 2394 habitations which do not have access to secondary school as per the school mapping and GIS mapping exercise which the State has carried out. However, as per the Gunutsav data 2011-12, 3485 locations have been identified as not having secondary school within a 5 kms radius. The basis and approach for identifying this has also been to trace the number of primary schools having class VIII (no of UPS-4989) which do not have a secondary schooling facility, is based on the assumption that every Upper Primary School has to be upgraded.
- 14.3. According to the GIS mapping exercise, there are 18833 habitations in the state. However as per the Gujarat AWP&B 2013-14 there are 26245 habitations. This huge discrepancy needs to be clarified by the State.
- 14.4. Kutch district has 15.53% GER, GER in Surendranagar is at 40.14%, and in Bhavnagar at 48.04%, which are all lower than the State average. According to the documents received from Gujarat State plan, GER and NER at Secondary stage are at 65.63 and 57.64 resp. Similarly GER and NER at elementary level is 103.45 and 98.97 respectively. Transition rate from class VIII to class IX is given at 110.30. These statements do not support each other.
- 14.5. There is an information gap on how the target GER of 100 present for the year 2016-17 will be achieved without the details of year-wise enrolment targets by location, gender and social category and the step by step intervention/ strategy of the Government to raise the GER from the present 65% to 100% in 3 years. There is no evidence of need based and contextual planning specifically for the focus groups



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14.6 In another example of the discrepancies in the UDISE, the number of Secondary and Higher Secondary covered under ICT do not tally with the numbers given in the plan (AWP&B).

- 14.7 GPI for the State is 0.71 which is lower than the national GPI of 0.88
- 14.8 As against the 72 schools approved in 2010-11, 70 are functional and two are not yet functional, since land for 2 schools is not yet available. Similarly, out of 254 schools approved in 2011-12, land is yet to be acquired for 74 schools. The government is yet to implement ICT in Schools in 410 Schools approved in 2009-10. The State has started civil works approved earlier in 2009-10,2010-11 and 2011-12 under RMSA only very recently.
- 14.9 1659 teacher's posts as approved in the 328 schools have not been recruited so far. In addition, there are excess Secondary School teachers in the State due to shifting of class VIII to elementary school. Gujarat Government has taken a decision that since there is a huge number of surplus teachers in Secondary Schools resulting from the Government detaching standard VIII from Secondary and attaching Class VIII to Elementary school, there will be no fresh recruitment but the surplus teachers are to be adjusted against RMSA approved posts. Therefore, there does not seem to be any need for new teachers in RMSA approved schools as the state is using the existing teachers from the State sanctioned posts for these new schools.
- 14.10 The AWP&B lacks information on the curriculum reform in the State and also regarding the training calendar for teachers training as well as the details of which subject areashow many teachers need to be trained, whether there was a need assessment, whether the State has created any resource pool for the training? Moreover, no integrated planning for teachers training with IEDSS and ICT is reflected in the Plan.
- 14.11 The State raised the issue of funds being received very late, thereby affecting the progress of implementation of the RMSA scheme in Gujarat. However, it was pointed out that in the year 2012-13, the year being the first year of the 12th Five Year Plan, no funds for fresh approvals were released to any State before August, 2012, since the Cabinet approval for continuation of 75:25 sharing pattern came only in August, 2012. In addition, due to the fact that the State did not send the requisite documents such as Utilization Certificates, information on



State Share, Bond, etc and due to the fact that the Model Code of Conduct was prevailing in Gujarat at that time, funds could not be released. However, funds were released from MHRD immediately after receipt of the Bond.

14.12 Due to discrepancies in UDISE, the number of secondary and higher secondary schools covered under ICT @ schools scheme given by the State in the plan does not match the data available with the Ministry. There also seems to be repetition/duplication of coverage of schools and also coverage of primary and middle schools as well as private schools under ICT @ schools scheme.

15.01 The State sent its supplementary plan and revised UDISE data on 17th June 2013 according to discussion in the PAB meeting of the 20th May 2013. As per the revised 'UDISE' data submitted by the State, the number of government schools in the State is 794 whereas as there are 666 government schools in the State as per the Model tables submitted with AWP&B 2013-14. This throws up the problem of data inconsistencies which also prevented the appraisal team from carrying out proper appraisal of the second proposal too. The State needs to work further to correct the data. In absence of correct UDISE data, limited recurring interventions like school grant, training etc are being approved with an advise to the State to take necessary action to work on the gaps in UDISE data.

15.02 In the supplementary plan, the components proposed for consideration are (i) Opening of 176 new secondary school with proposal for construction and recurring cost, (ii) Construction of 142 Residential Quarters for teachers in Tribal areas, (iii) Salary of teaching staff for existing RMSA schools approved in the year 2010-11 & 2011-12, (iv) Comprehensive 2 month in-service training for 5000 teachers, (v) Professional Development Programme for Government schools Principals/ In charge Principals and Class –II Educational Service officers by NEUPA or IIM Ahmedabad for 300 Principals @ Rs. 60000 per person for Rs. 180 lakh, (vi) Professional Development Programme for District Educational Officers (DEOs) by IIM Ahmedabad for 27 DEOs @ Rs. 60,000 per person, (vii) Empowering Girls training course in Government schools @ Rs. 2000 per girl for 12370 girls in 666 schools (viii) Guidance and Counselling for students (ix) Remedial Teaching, (x) Science Kit for schools, (xi) Promotion of science at District level-Organising Exhibition in Districts, (xii) Book Fair and Quiz competition at District level, (xiii)

Encouragement to sports: Sports equipment in schools, (xiv) School Grant for 666 schools and (xv) MMER. Some of these components are repetition of the proposals received in the earlier AWP&B with no additional details - for example, school grant, empowering girls training course, remedial teaching, science kit, sports kits, science exhibition and book fair. These components are approved as per norm and as per UDISE data. With the revised UDISE data, the approval for these components has been revised as per the revised data submitted by the State. The State had requested the PAB that the previously approved 142 Residential Quarters may be shifted to Tribal areas. However the supplementary plan does not mention about relocation of the earlier approved quarters as per the agreement of the PAB but is actually a proposal for new quarters in tribal areas in addition to the already approved quarters. The components proposed in the supplementary plan are dealt in the approval section.

PAB was informed that 6380 schools have been covered under ICT@ Schools schemein the State. However, UDISE code discrepency/ difference in respect of 319 schools exists. The PAB was also informed that the State has not implemented ICT @ Schools in the 410 schools approved under the scheme in 2009-10.

The State has proposed for implementation of ICT@ School in 5 schools as SMART school. However, due to shortage of funds and also due to large number of discrepancies in the data, this was not approved. Further, funds release with regard to committed liabilities and previous approval is contingent upon the State's clarification on the above discrepancies.

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- 19. It was pointed out by the Joint Secretary (SE&L) that the proposal submitted for appraisal and consideration of the PAB needed to be re-examined by the State. It was submitted that the overall numbers of CWSN students and the special educators quoted by the State, does not match with the details provided under UDISE or even with the school wise list provided by the State. She also informed that since there have been court cases relating to special educators in the state specially under the NGO component and some more cases are pending on this issue, it would be prudent for the State to review its proposal and resubmit with fully verified facts and details to avoid any decision that is not based on facts.
- Principal Secretary (Education), State Govt. of Gujarat, agreed with need for such an exercise and sought a month's time to rework on the proposal.

Girls Hostel

- 21. State Govt. submitted the proposal for non-recurring grant of Rs.21506.70 lakh including grant for furniture and equipments for construction of 85 girls hostels in the State. The proposal was based on State Schedule of Rates (SORs) and the checklist and other relevant documents/certificates were submitted along with the proposal. 82 hostels were proposed to be constructed within the campus of Model Schools and 03 in the campus of secondary schools.
- 22. Out of the total 85 Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) in the State, 78 hostels had already been approved by PAB in 2009-10 but funds were not released for want of certain information. 07 fresh hostels were placed before PAB for approval. Based on the recommendations of the Appraisal Team, PAB approved all the 85 girls hostels including 7 new hostels at State SORs with a unit area of 12172.79 sq.ft. As SORs differ from district to district, the approved cost of hostels varies from Rs.173.33 lacs to Rs.204.03 lacs. The total cost approved for all the hostels is Rs.16350.37 lacs plus MMER @ 2.5%. The details of the hostels and the cost approved for each hostel are at Annexure VI



Vocational Education

- 23. The state has not provided any proposal for Vocational Education for 2013-14
- 24. Based on above the approvals accorded for various interventions in respect of all 5 Schemes, the interventions amounting to Rs. 18048.11 lakhs with the Central Share amounting to Rs. 16050.01 lakhs and State share of Rs. 1998.11 lakh have been approved. The MMER in respect of all these Schemes for the approved interventions will come to Rs. 470.14 lakh. The Scheme-wise depiction of the proposals of the State and approvals accorded by PAB in financial term is captured in the following table:

- The release of funds to different schemes will be further guided by the following conditions:
 - (i) The State Administration shall give a written commitment for meeting its share of the RMSA, ICT@ School, IEDSS, Girls Hostel & Vocational Education of the budget approved according to prescribed sharing pattern of the schemes.
 - (ii) SMDCs or equivalent bodies should be constituted and accounts opened to incur
 expenditure under school grant, minor repair, civil works, and other such



- expenditures, which have to be incurred only through these bodies as per RMSA norms.
- (iii) The State Government will maintain their level of investment in Secondary education as in 2009-2010 and give the details of this to GOI before the release of second installment. The contribution as UT share for RMSA will be over and above this investment.


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

Major Issue (Planning related)

The plan is not based on UDISE

The UDISE submitted by the State has huge discrepancies, appraisal from ha taken the revised data on schools, teachers and students as base for the recommendation. Hence recommendations are subject to corrections of UDISE data:

Due to huge discrepancies in UDSE, number of Secondary and Higher secondary covered under ICT is not matching with the number given in the plan.

The data submitted by State Indicates data discrepancies and need for data clasming and analysis. Examples drop out rate in Anahol (16.68%), drop out rate in 6.56 and 51 in Sabarhantha (185.40% and 74.27%), drop out rate in Portlander (196.21%), transition rate Mehsana (201.90%), Portlander (164.42%) and Gandhinsson (169.75%).

No evidence of need based and contextual planning specifically for the focus groups. Information provided in the various chapters is repetitive

GIS mapping conducted in 2010-11, estimated the requirement of new secondary school as 644.

Regulterment is as per Gunotsav year 2011-12. Need of 3485 secondary schools, the schools which have classes upto class 8° and do not have a single secondary schools within 5 km radius.

According to GIS mapping evercise, there are 18833 habitations and there are 26245 habitations as per ANP&B 2013-14.


