Minutes of the 30th Project Approval Board (PAB) of the 10th Integrated RMSA meeting held on 3rd July 2013 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 of the state of Tamil Nadu

- The 30th meeting of the PAB (10th Integrated RMSA) for considering the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 for the states of Tamil Nadu, A&N Islands, Jammu and Kashmir and Haryana in respect of the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), ICT @ Schools (ICT), Girls' Hostels (GH), Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary Stage (IEDSS) and Vocational Education (VE) was held on the 3rd July, 2013 under the Chairmanship of Shri R. Bhattacharya, Secretary (SE&L).
- The list of participants who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure-I. 2.

Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA)

- At the outset, the Secretary (SE &L) informed the participants that in respect of RMSA, the Government of India has favourably considered various long pending demands of the States and UTs in respect of adoption of State Schedule of Rates (SoRs) in civil works, enhancement of percentage of funds under Management, Monitoring, Evaluation and Research (MMER), continuance of the 75:25 sharing pattern between Centre and States and extension of quality related interventions of the scheme to Government aided schools. He also clarified that the revised norms relating to applicability of SoRs and enhanced MMER provisions will be applicable prospectively.
- Ms. Caralyn K Deshmukh, Director (RMSA I) then presented the status of the state in the secondary education sector, including identifying areas of concerns and highlighting achievements of the State. A copy of presentation is at Annexure II

5. Areas of Strength:

- 5.1 The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in Secondary Classes (IX and X) of the State is at 107.40 & Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) is at 94.71 which is the highest in the Country. The GPI (Gender Parity Index) is also good.
- 5.2 The State Govt. has taken the initiative to carry out gap funding (Rate based on the SSOR & the unit cost approved by RMSA) for constructions of civil works approved previously on a fixed cost norm by mobilizing financial resources from within the State.
- 5.3 The state has developed State Curriculum Framework 2009 based on the National Curriculum Framework 2005.

6. Areas of concern:

- 6.1 The dropout rate at state level is 8.33. The dropout rate and the transition rates in all the districts are similar, which the state needs to look more closely as there are variations from district to district.
- 6.2 Out of the previously approved total 1254 New schools, the state has not yet started the civil construction on 1054 schools and no civil works for strengthening of 2308 existing Schools has been taken-up till date.
- 6.3 Though the quantitative achievements is visible in the educational indicators but the quality achievements is yet to come through. (Ref: ASER report 2012).
- 6.4 Though the State has achieved access rate of almost 78%, there are 16899 habitation which do not yet have any access to secondary schools and on the basis of school mapping) 690 schools have been identified for upgradation. (out of these, 65% are in difficult terrain.)
- 6.5 The State has changed the location of 201 of the previously approved (2011-12) new schools. (Schools to be upgraded)
- 6.6 Discrepancy found in the UDISE data.

Special Focus Districts (SFD) and Convergence:

7. Out of the 32 districts in Tamil Nadu, 7 districts are SFDs (All SC concentrated) and there are 44 Educationally Backward Blocks in the State. As far as non-recurring

interventions are concerned; there is no fresh approval for 2013-14. Out of the 5665 Govt. Secondary schools, 5665 schools were covered under RMSA and 4217 schools were covered under ICT Scheme. As far as convergence is concerned in respect of 44 EBBs; the EBBs is covered under both the scheme of RMSA and GH.

Progress under RMSA:

- 8. **Recurring:** In the last financial year i.e. 2012-13, in the background that no PAB meeting were held and no new approval were given in the whole country, a total outlay of Rs. 46174.84 lakhs for continuing recurring activities was approved for the State with a central share of Rs. 34631.13 lakh, out of which Rs 18113.87 lakh along with the state release of Rs. 5887.01 lakh after adjusting the available funds to the tune of Rs. 12262.49 lakh with the State Govt., Progress of 68 % has been shown with an expenditure of Rs 24759.29 lakh.
- 9. Non Recurring: In the previous years, under RMSA 1254 new schools were approved for up-gradation from Upper Primary to Secondary schools and 2032 schools were approved for strengthening of existing secondary schools under civil works. The performance of the State in respect of civil works is not encouraging.

The Principal Secretary, Education of the State informed PAB that due to fixed norms for civil works under RMSA, they could not undertake the civil works. However, the State Government has agreed to provide the gap funding for civil works approved under RMSA in 2009-10 and

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these works are likely to be completed by October 2013. The State Govt. is looking to fill in the gap with regard to civil works approved in 2010-11 & 2011-12 also, however, the requirement is huge. The Principal Secretary-Education however, informed that all the schools approved so far have been made functional and State has also provided toilet and drinking water facility in all the schools in convergence with the programmes of the Rural Development Ministry. Keeping in view the huge liability, the point was raised with regard to cancellation of the 201 Schools approved in 2011-12 which the State has opened in other locations other than the ones approved. and the implication on Teacher's salary as these schools are all functional. It was also pointed out that the schools were approved after the due diligence of whether in accordance with the distance and enrolment norms, the schools qualify to be secondary schools or not in accordance with RMSA norms. The PAB, in the year 2011-12 had decided that States may not change the location or the list of schools approved, and if done so, these schools stand to be cancelled if in case they do not conform to the norms.

Issues:

It was brought to the notice of PAB that there is shortfall of state share of Rs. 197.86 crore against central releases till 31st March 2013.

Annual Work Plan and Budget of 2013-14:

11. Thereafter, the intervention-wise discussion was held and the following decisions were taken:

Principal Secretary requested for acceptance of the changes made. The Secretary (SE&L)-cum-Chairman, PAB praised the mandate of the State in insuring the community involvement, but in light of the policy of according approval for upgradation by the PAB & to insure similarity across the States, he requested the State to submit the rationale of all 201 changed locations/Schools for appraisal. Accordingly the State submitted the requisite vide letter no. 2269/A2/RMSA/2013 dt. 22.07.2013 & after due diligence it was found that only 43 Schools are meeting the criteria of distance as well as enrolment and the rest 158 do not meet the criteria. Among these 43, only 12 schools fulfil both the norms of 5 Km distance from the habitation and from an existing government and government aided school and a minimum of 70 enrolled children in class VIII. In the case of 31 schools, considering that the location of the schools is in the SFDs(29 in nos.) and also in the hilly region(02 in nos.), the enrolment criteria is being relaxed to 50 for double section school and 25 for Single section school in line with the earlier PAB decisions made in similar circumstances. It was decided to accept the changes in location in case of these 43(42 Schools with double Section & one with Single Section) and for the rest 158 schools, the approval is cancelled. Thus, the amended approval for upgradation / new school for the year 2011-'12 will now be 552 (550 Schools with double Section & 02 with Single Section) instead of 710 (709 Schools with double Section & 01 with Single Section) and accordingly the amendment in teacher post as well as under construction/non-rec. should also be made. The details of the amendment in the approval of 2011-'12 in respect of new schools is attached at Annexure-III(a) & the list of eligible 43 schools and 158 non-eligible schools, out of the 201 changed one is attached at Annexure- III(b-i & ii) . And as far as the non-submission of UDISE code for 01 school approved in the same year is concerned, the State clarified that the particular school , namely PUMS Perungalathur, Block- Arakkonam, District- Vellore, is not there in the UDISE database. The State is to take steps in this regard and inform Ministry on this.

2. Strengthening of existing Govt. schools:

 The State Government had proposed for construction of 1761 additional classrooms, 956 Integrated Science Labs, 417 Computer rooms, 751 Library rooms, 1554 Toilet Block and 137 water facility under strengthening of existing

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schools. However, due to the huge spill over from earlier approvals, no fresh proposal was approved.

- · Further from the UDISE, It was found that the
 - a) The UDISE code of 27 schools (List attached at Annexure- IV(a)) sanctioned in previous years under the strengthening shows that school is un-aided
 - o ACR: 58
 - o Science Lab: 17

 - o Library: 25
 - o Water: 5
 - o Toilet: 10
 - b) The UDISE Code for 2 schools(List attached at Annexure- IV(b)) sanctioned in previous years under the strengthening was not correct
 - o Science Lab: 2
 - o Computer Room: 2
 - o Art Cultural: 2
 - o Library: 2
 - o Water: 1
 - o Toilet: 2
 - c) The UDISE Code for 2 schools (List attached at Annexure- IV(c)), one each under the Major repair & Residential Quarter head, sanctioned in previous years, was not correct where as in one case the code was duplicate. (under Major air,)

The State is to take steps to examine this and clarify the same to the Ministry by 30th September.

RECURRING

- 1. Staff for new schools sanctioned in previous years (2009-2013)
 - Against the State's proposal of salary for 1254 Schools' Teachers, Lab attendant & Office assistant, the salary for only 1096 Schools(6568 Subject Teachers, 1096 Lab Attendants and 896 Office Assistant) has been approved. These 1096 Schools also includes 43 eligible schools out of the 201 changed schools from the 2011-'12 sanction. The Salary for 5150 Subject Teachers, 1096 Lab Attendants and 613 Office Assistant who are in position is approved for 12 months and for the rest

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who are yet to be appointed position, the salary provision is made for 6 months, but the same will be released only after State confirms with documentary proof about their recruitment and actual posting.

2. Additional staff for existing schools

• The State proposed for salary of 6752 (additional) subject teachers, 4393 Lab attendant and 1764 Office assistants approved in the year 2011-12. The salary in respect of 3654 Subject Teachers and 441 Office Assistants who are in position is approved for 12 months & for the rest who are being recruited, the salary provision is made for 6 months, but the same will be released only after State confirms with documents about their recruitment & actual positioning.

3. School Grant:

 The proposal of school grant for 5677 Government Secondary schools was approved as proposed by state, where as the State's proposal of school grant in respect of Govt. Aided School was not approved as School Grant is restricted to only the government schools.

4. Minor Repair:

Against the State's proposal of the minor repair grant for 4423 Schools, the
approval was restricted to 4402 Government Secondary Schools having their
own building, as per the UDISE data. 6 schools which have not been considered
are since the buildings are in a dilapidated condition and 15 schools have
buildings under construction. The State's proposal of minor repair grant in
respect of Govt. Aided School was not approved as this intervention is
restricted to government schools only.

5. Teacher Training:

- a. As against the proposal of the State for training of 1891 Head Masters(HM), training of 750 Head Masters was approved @ Rs. 8000 per HM to be undertaken through NUEPA under their programme called "School leadership programme"
- b. Approval of In-service training of the proposed 45252 existing teachers was restricted to 20000 existing teachers, due to slow progress in previous years' approvals.
- c. Induction Training for 6752 new teachers was restricted to 4443 newly recruited teachers who are yet to avail of the induction training. The proposal for training

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- of 640 Key Resource Persons (KRPs) is restricted to 160 KRPs @ 1 KRP per subject for 5 subjects in each district.
- d. The proposal to train 1650 Master Resource Persons was restricted to 800 KRPs
 a 5 MRPs per subject per district.
- e. The proposal for Module Preparation workshop for 5 subjects by subject experts groups 20 resource persons per subject was not approved as the State has already prepared the modules.
- f. The proposal for Module typeset and design for 5 subjects was not approved in accordance with the decision above.
- g. The proposal for a 5 days Training for the Physical Education Teachers –and one day for Chess training was not approved as these activities can be part of In Service Training.
- h. The proposal for Heritage Craft Training for Art and Craft teachers was suggested to be part of In Service Training, hence not approved separately.
- The proposal for training for Arts & Music Teachers was suggested to be part of In Service Training and hence not approved separately.

6. Quality Interventions:

- a. The PAB has in general taken a view that in light of the primary focus being on providing access and limited fund being available for quality interventions (which includes committed components such as teacher's salary, training and related interventions), there is a need to prioritize. In this context, local excursions/tours especially in States where it has been provided in previous years successively may not be considered a priority intervention. The States may be advised to take it up as a local initiative, accordingly, the interventions i.e., Excursion trip to students within the state, Study tours for students outside the state; Excursion trip for Teachers within the State, Study tour for Teachers outside the state were not approved by the PAB.
- b. The proposal for conduct of Science Exhibition at district level was approved as proposed for 32 districts @ Rs. 1 lakh per district and it is suggested to converge the same with NCERT activities.
- c. The proposal of the State for organizing Book Fair in 32 districts was approved @
 Rs. 1 lakh per district.

- d. The proposal of EDUSAT for Schools in the remote Corners (Newly Upgraded Schools) was not approved, as neither details were made available nor sufficient fund available under RMSA.
- e. The state has proposed for Learning Resource Centre for Schools which are not having any integrated science lab (and for Maths kits)- for newly upgraded schools @ Rs. 1500/- per kit for 10 kit per school was not approved as all the newly upgraded Schools have been accorded with the Science Lab & the equipment for the same.
- f. The proposal for 1836 Sports kit for newly upgraded schools @ Rs. 15000/- per school is restricted to 100 schools as done for other states.
- g. The State has proposed for development of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) package for secondary classes and distribution of assessment of material and software for comparison for secondary classes @ Rs. 1500/- per school..The State may undertake this activity from its MMER amount and a report may be made on this. The availability of the CBSE tools was also pointed out. The State proposed for printing and distribution of CCE modules for Sections in 5678 Government schools was not approved as the same is linked with the previous activity, which was not approved as per the para above.
- h. It was suggested that the proposal of SMART Card for tracking the students in secondary classes (pilot with the hardest to reach 7684 eligible IEDSS students in secondary classes) may be done by the State on its own. This was not approved separately.
- The State's proposal of Bridge Course for 106860 students who need remedial teaching in class IX was approved.
- j. The proposal for Motivation and Re-orientation camp for Tribal, Hilly Special Focus Group students in Class 10 (for 5 days) was not approved. It was suggested that this may be carried out in convergence with Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- k. Convergence with the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports may be explored for Preparing Secondary Schools for Athletic Events and Games. This was not approved separately.

7. Guidance and Counselling:

a. The Salary of 5 Resource Person at State Level was approved, as proposed.

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- b. Proposal for setting up of Guidance and Resource centre by providing psychological test/tool/guidance/career literature display material etc. @50,000/was approved for state level. Documentation may be done and a report may be sent to the Ministry on this.
- c. The proposal of one Research assistant @ Rs.1.00 lakh per year -for state at SCERT and for 32 districts at DIET was restricted to one Research Assistant in 32 districts @ Rs. 1 lakh per district. However, the functions and activities of the Research Assistants and the Counsellors at the State level will have to be clarifies. There is a need to ensure convergence with the Adolescent Education Programme of the NCERT as well as with other activities aimed at preventing Bullying, Ragging. Career Counselling, Subject Options counselling for Higher Classes may also be dealt with by the Cell.
- d. Sensitisation programme for two days for teacher counsellor working at school @Rs, 40,000 per batch (5678 Schools, 2 Teachers Counsellor each, 40 per batch, 284 Batches) was not approved & it was suggested that the same may be part of In service training.
- e. Training the members of district child protection unit and one member from CWC for the psychological counselling was not approved as there is no norm. This is part of the activities of the Counselling Cell and the RAs at the district level.

8. Equity Interventions:

8.1 Girls oriented activities:

- a. The proposal for participatory rural appraisal (PRA) for mobilizing girls for secondary classes in educationally backward blocks needs to be the part of MMER. Therefore this was not approved separately.
- b. The proposal for special mobilization camp for enrolment among the special focus group (SCs/STs, Minorities, girls) through Kala Jatha (cultural activities) was not approved separately. This may be part of the approved special Kalajattha camp for SFDs.
- c. The proposal for Special Enrolment drive in Special Focus Districts (SFDs) (5-SC/ST Concentration Area + 9 Female low literacy area) and also in the special students CWSN was not approved separately but this may be part of MMER.

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	 d. The proposal of Motivation & self-esteem camp in special focus districts by inviting Girls celebrities in role model programmes in SC & ST Concentrated areas (5- SC/ST Concentration Area) as well as in 9 low Female literacy area & in CWSN dominated districts, in coordination with Ability Foundation was not approved, as the rationale for the proposal is not convincing and the costs proposed are too high. This activity may be perhaps be carried out through the Department of Women and Child Development in co-ordination with the Tribal Affairs and Social Justice Department. e. The proposal for a 2 day counselling camp for below–poverty- line meritorious student in Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) was not approved due to insufficient details. f. The proposal for Life skill training for Girls Students in 44 EBBs was not approved. The Guidance and Counselling cell may perhaps take up these activities in convergence/ so ordination with NCERT/NACO.

ICT @ School Scheme

12. PAB was informed that till date 5151 schools were covered under ICT@ Schools scheme. However, UDISE code discrepancy/ difference in respect of 1041 schools was detected as per the details mentioned below:

13. The Principal Secretary-Education, Tamil Nadu, assured that the State check and sort out the discrepancy. Director (ICT) also informed that the State Govt. is still to implement the scheme in the schools approved in 2010-11 and 2011-12. It was informed that the State had tendered twice but due to a clause in the tender that the payment will be tied to the outcome at the end of the project, the BOOT vendors are not forthcoming. The state is again going for tendering and will start implementation in this financial year. Secretary(SE&L) appreciating the

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method adopted for devising tender documents, desired that the state may share the tender documents with the Ministry so that it can be examined for replication in other states also.

14. It was also decided that further release of committed liability/ expenditure in respect of schools already covered will be subject to the State clarifying the details of the schools (name, location, Govt. or Govt aided, Secondary/ Higher Secondary/ Middle Schools etc) along with providing the UDISE code for schools approved earlier apart from providing other documents such as Utilisation Certificate, Progress Report etc.

Fresh proposal for 2013-14 under ICT

15. The State proposed for approval for coverage of 431 schools and 10 smart schools for 2013-14. Since the state has yet to implement the scheme in the previously approved 4340 schools and 5 smart schools no fresh proposal was approved.

Vocational Education

- 16. As part of the Integrated Annual Work Plan and Budget for 2013-14, the proposal of the Government of Tamil Nadu for strengthening of vocational education in 431 existing schools across 12 trades was considered by the PAB. In view of the fact that old courses have been proposed by the State for which National Occupation Standards and competency based curriculum are not available, the proposal could not be approved.
- 17. Further, information regarding names of schools, mapping of trades against schools, enrolment of students, deployment of teachers, qualification of the existing teachers, consultation with the industry, scheme of combination of subjects and convergence with other schemes, was not found in the plan. The costing sheet was also not found to be in accordance with the norms of the schemes.
- 18. Hence, the State Government of Tamil Nadu was requested to revise and resubmit the proposal for consideration of the Ministry. The State was also suggested to consider selecting any of the four courses/job roles (in accordance with the skill requirement of the State) viz. IT/ITeS, Automobile, Retail and Security for which NOS and curriculum and courseware has

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been developed or any of the job roles in Security, Telecom, Healthcare, Rubber, Media & Entertainment and IT/ITeS sectors where NOS are likely to be launched shortly.

19. The State Government of Tamil Nadu was also requested to refund Rs. 285.87 lakhs lying unspent with the State released under the pre-revised scheme.

IEDSS Scheme

Non- Recurring Grant

- State Govt. presented the proposal for release of non-recurring grant for:
 - i) 412 resource rooms and equipment for them;
 - ii) removal of architectural barriers and construction of new toilets in 412 schools;
 - iii) strengthening of 32 training institutes;
 - iv) support to 4 NGOs for development of training programmes;
 - v) IEDSS cell resource development in State Resource Centre; and
 - vi) Development of 32 Model Inclusive Schools.
- 21. PAB was informed that the non-recurring grant of Rs.19.68 cr. was approved in 2011-12 for all the above items except for items no. (iv) and (v) but the funds were not released for want of comments and Action Taken Report (ATR) from the State Govt. on the report/recommendations of the Committee which conducted the enquiry on the implementation of IEDSS scheme in the State during 8-10 Sept. 2011 based on the complaint forwarded by PMO. State representative informed that the ATR was given to the Ministry (TSG) on 2nd July 2013 only. State was informed that the matter regarding release of funds for these items would be taken separately. State was also advised to meet the expenditure on items no.(v) and (vi) from MMER funds. No fresh approval for the above items was given by PAB for 2013-14.

Recurring Grant

- 22. State also proposed for release of recurring grant for the following items:
 - i) Salary of 1863 New Special Education Teachers;
 - Salary of 202 Special Education Teachers sanctioned in previous years;
 - iii) Assistance & equipments to 10324 CWSN under Student Oriented Component;
 - iv) In-service training for 52004 existing teachers;

- v) Training to 2065 Special Education Teachers; and
- vi) Orientation of principals, educational administrators, parents/guardians, etc. For 5809 persons;
- vii) Environment Building Programmes for 412 blocks; and
- viii) 143 helpers / ayah for severely orthopaedic CWSN.
- 23. State informed that the recruitment of new special education teachers was under process and would be completed in another 2-3 months. State was informed that the requirement of special teachers is based on the number of CWSN left after deducting the students with locomotors disability. As per UDISE there are 1930 students with locomotors disabilities. So after deducting this from the total figure of 9734 CWSN, maximum of 1561 special teachers could be recruited under this Scheme for 7804 CWSN in the ratio of one teacher for 5 students. As 202 special education teachers are already in position, 1350 new special education teachers could be considered. Similarly assistance under Student Oriented Component could be considered for 8736 CWSN after deducting 545 students with speech impairment and 453 with learning disabilities from the total of 9734 CWSN as per UDISE data.
- 24. For in-service training of existing teachers and orientation programme of Principals, parents/guardians, etc. Addl. Secretary (SE) advised the State to seek convergence with RMSA wherein these items have been approved. Assistance for helpers and ayahs is covered under Student Oriented Component. As such no fresh approval was given for these items for 2013-14.
- 25. After detailed discussions PAB approved recurring grant of Rs. 3249.93 lakh including MMER for the following items:
 - 06 months salary for 1350 new special education teachers proposed to be recruited @ Rs.26500/- p.m. but the funds would be released only after State confirms the recruitment along with their details, RCI numbers, etc.;
- ii) Salary for 202 special education teachers in position @ Rs.26500/-pm,;
- iii) Assistance under 'Student Oriented Activities' for 8736 CWSN subject to a maximum of Rs.3000/-p.a. per student. Funds would be released after State furnishes item-wise details;
 - iv) Training to 202 special education teachers in position @ Rs.300/- per teacher per day for 3 days;
 - v) Environmental building programme for 412 blocks @ Rs.10,000/- per block.
- 26. Calculation sheet showing component-wise details is at Annexure-VI

Girls Hostel Scheme

Recurring Grant

- 27. State had submitted the proposal for opening of 44 girls hostels in temporary locations from Sept. 2013 in all the 44 Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) of the State. State informed that though the construction of hostels had already been started in these EBBs but as it might take some more time to complete, they propose to start the hostels in temporary locations. The accommodation have also been identified near KGBVs and the rent agreement would be signed after the proposal is approved. State also expected the enrolment of 100 girls in each hostel.
- 28. Secretary (SE&L) enquired about the progress of construction of hostels for which Rs.28.18 crore was released. State replied that almost all the hostels are under construction and utilization of Rs.27.00 crore would be shown till Dec. 2013. Keeping in view the State's endeavor to start the hostels, PAB approved recurring grant of Rs. 592.20 lakh including MMER for making these 44 hostels functional from rented accommodation from Sept. 2013. State was also informed that the rent would be sanctioned for a maximum of nine months and beyond that State Govt. would bear the rental in case the hostels still continue running in rented accommodation. The component-wise calculation sheet is at Annexure-VII
- 29. Based on above the approvals accorded for various interventions in respect of all five Schemes, the recurring & non-recurring interventions amounting to Rs. 54930.36 lakh with the Central Share amounting to Rs. 42099.08 lakh and State share of Rs. 12831.28 lakh have been approved. The MMER in respect of all these Schemes for the approved interventions will come to Rs. 1560.708 lakh. The Scheme-wise depiction of the proposals of the State and approvals accorded by PAB in financial term is capitulated in the following table:

- 30. The release of funds to different schemes will be further guided by the following conditions:
 - (i) The State Administration shall give a written commitment for meeting its share of the RMSA, ICT@ School, IEDSS, Girls Hostel & Vocational Education of the budget approved according to prescribed sharing pattern of the schemes.
 - (ii) SMDCs or equivalent bodies should be constituted and accounts opened to incur expenditure under school grant, minor repair, civil works, and other such expenditures, which have to be incurred only through these bodies as per RMSA norms.
 - (iii) The State Government will maintain their level of investment in Secondary education as in 2009-2010 and give the details of this to GOI before the release of second instalment. The contribution as UT share for RMSA will be over and above this investment.
 - (iv) The second instalment would only be released after (a) the proportionate instalment of State share has been transferred to the State Implementation Society, (b) at least 50% expenditure against available funds has been incurred, (c) utilization certificate has been submitted for funds released in the year 2012-13 and (d) Audit Reports have been submitted for the year 2011-12.
- The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
