Regulating the Coaching Centres

Sir,

To,

The issue of regulating private coaching institutions, especially in the context of rising student sulcides therein; has come for elaborate discussion both in Parliament and in the Ashok Misra Committee report.

2. It was reported that most of these coaching institutions are not recognised under Regulation, charge exorbitant fees, place undue stress on the students at the cost of the extra-curricular activities. As such, it was recommended to regulate these institutions in the interests of students and their overall development.

3. Considering that regulation of +2 level education is the responsibility of the State Government, it is felt that these institutions are best regulated by the State Governments, covering the above aspects and prescribing strict penalty system for the deviant institutions.

4. In order to address the issue of student suicides, the Justice Roopanwal Commission of Enguiry has suggested a set of (12) measures (enclosed) for implementation in the educational institutions. These can be kept in view while framing the Regulation by the State Government.

5. The action taken in this regard may kindly be inform.

## easures recommended by Justice Roopanwal Committee to address the issue of student suicides.

- 1. The university should evolve a mechanism where the students can appeal in case there is any excess by the university.
- Counselling Centres consisting of professionally trained counsellors should be set up which shall provide services to students, research scholars and faculty including non-teaching staff.
- Monitoring Committees should be constituted which should be headed by the supervisors who would provide guidance on the matters related to the subjects studied by the students.

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- 4. Equal opportunity cell headed by the Anti-discrimination Officer as per the UGC (Promotion of Equity in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations 2012 should be made functional.
- 5. Grievance Redressal Committee headed by the Ombudsman as per the UGC (Grievance Redressal) Regulations 2012 should be made effective.
- 6. Strong induction programme for better acclimatisation.
- 7. Establish (as far as possible) local guardian system for outstation students.
- 8. Grievances to be discussed and dispensed with on weekly basis and Vice Chancellor to hold meetings on monthly basis.
- 9. Remedial teaching for academically weak students.
- 10 Deans to closely monitor Department problems. Any serious issue to be brought to the notice of Vice Chancellor immediately.
- 11. University to select suitable student volunteers to act as mentors and help freshers.
- 12. Effective administration and supervision of Hostels and strict compliance of Hostel Admission Rules and Regulations so that only current students allotted hostel accommodation by the University stay in the hostels.
