### Notification

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 38 of the Right of Children to Free and compulsory Education Act, 2009 (35 of 2009) (RTE) the State Government hereby makes the following Rules, namely:

## 1. Short Title and Commencement:

- (1) These rules may be called the Arunachal Pradesh Right of children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2010.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- (3) They shall extend to the whole of Arunachal Pradesh.

## PART - I - Preliminary

### 2. <u>Definition:</u>

- (1) In this rules, unless the context otherwise requires:
  - (a) "Act" Means the Right of Children Free and compulsory Education Act, 2009 (35 of 2009).
  - (b) "Anganwadi" means an Anganwadi centre established under the Integrated Child Development Service Scheme of the Ministry of Women and Child Development of the Government of India.
  - (c) "Child" Means a Male or Female child of the age of 6-14 years.
  - (d) "Pupil Cumulative Record" means the record of the progress of the child based on comprehensive and continuous evaluation (CCE).
  - (e) "School Mapping" means planning school location (for the purpose of section 6 of the Act) to over come social barriers and geographical distance.
  - (f) "Capitation Fee" means any kind of donation or contribution or payment other than the fee notify by the school.
  - (g) "Elementary Education" means the education from class one to eight.
  - (h) "Child Belonging to Weaker Section" means a child belonging to such parents/
    guardians whose annual income is lower than the minimum limit specified in BPL
    families by the State Government.
  - (i) "Local Authority" Means a Municipal corporation/Municipal council/Zilla Parishad/ Panchayat by whatever name called, in a city town or village.
  - (j) "Notification" means a notification published in the Official Gazette.
